9		Department of Homeland Security, Office of Domestic Preparedness, Homeland					
10		Security Grant Program on a reimbursement basis to finance equipment purchases,					
11		training costs and other needs for homeland security; and					
12	WHEREAS,	the Letter of Offer and Acceptance was approved in the form attached hereto by the					
13		Tohono O'odham Legislative Council through Resolution 05-489 and subsequently					
14		signed by the Chairwoman; and					
15	WHEREAS,	on 12/05/05, the Tohono O'odham Nation was awarded a grant from the Arizona					
16		Department of Emergency and Military Affairs in the amount of \$100,000.00 as part					
17		of the 2005 grant program for the purchase of specific equipment needed for					
18		enhancing the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department SWAT Team; and					
19	WHEREAS,	the 2005 grant award of \$100,000.00 has been reviewed by the Office of Grants &					
20		Contracts, Executive Office, Domestic Affairs Committee and Budget & Finance					
21		Committee, of which all recommend acceptance of the grant award by the Legislative					
22		Council.					
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves and						
24		accepts the grant award of \$100,000.00 on a reimbursement basis from the Tohono					
25		O'odham Nation General Fund for the purchase of equipment needed for enhancing					
26		the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department SWAT Team and further approves the					
27		indirect cost to administer this grant as it stipulates within the grant program
