# **RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** (Approving the Tohono O'odham Nation's Joinder in the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement System)

## **RESOLUTION NO.** <u>06-084</u>

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") employs commissioned police officers and
2		certified firefighters to protect and to serve our O'odham communities; and
3	WHEREAS,	these commissioned police officers and certified firefighters daily encounter
4		hazardous working conditions and put their lives on the line in the course of their
5		duties; and
6	WHEREAS,	due to a demand throughout Arizona for dedicated commissioned police officers and
7		certified firefighters, the Nation encounters difficulty attracting and retaining
8		qualified commissioned police officers and certified firefighters; and
9	WHEREAS,	the state of Arizona has created a defined benefit pension plan for public safety
10		employees, primarily commissioned police officers and certified firefighters, that
11		provides guaranteed retirement pay after 20 years of service, disability retirement
12		for public safety employees injured on the job or off the job, a survivor pension for the
13		spouse and children of a public safety employee killed on the job or after retirement,
14		and related benefits; and
15	WHEREAS,	the Arizona pension plan differs from the Nation's current 401(k) retirement plan in
16		that it provides guaranteed payments at a specified percentage of the officer's pay
17		from the date of retirement until the officer's death, from a state administered fund
18		which pools the contributions of all participants, and the Nation's 401(k) retirement
19		plan creates an investment account for each individual employee which is invested
20		at the direction of the employee and whose retirement payments are determined by
21		the amount in the account; and
22	WHEREAS,	a pension plan such as that offered by Arizona provides greater economic security
23		during retirement than a 401(k) plan, and is an effective recruitment and retention
24		tool; and
25	WHEREAS,	Arizona law specifically allows Indian tribes to join the pension plan system for
26		public safety employees; and
27	WHEREAS,	the Arizona pension plan requires that each employee participant pay in a
28		contribution of 7.65% of their wages into the fund, and that the Nation, as employer,

1		pay in a contribution of 9.53% of wages for commissioned police officers and 9.82%
2		of wages for certified firefighters; and
3	WHEREAS,	any governmental entity joining the state pension plan system may choose to buy in
4		to the program in an amount determined by the prior years of service of each
5		employee joining the system, which buy in amount can be paid in one lump sum at
6		the time of joinder or in installment payments over time; and
7	WHEREAS,	the Executive Office in cooperation with the Tohono O'odham Department of Public
8		Safety has determined that the buy in amount for the Nation's current commissioned
9		police officers and certified firefighters is \$6,414,818.03, and that the most cost
10		effective method of joining the system is to pay the buy in amount in one lump sum
11		at the time of joinder; and
12	WHEREAS,	the proposal to fund the buy in amount through appropriation from the Nation's
13		gaming savings has been presented to the districts of the Nation by the Executive
14		Office and the Department of Public Safety, and eight districts have supported the
15		proposal; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Domestic Affairs and the Budget & Finance Committees have reviewed this
17		joinder proposal.
18	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:
19		1. Approves the Nation's joinder in the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement
20		System for all eligible commissioned police officers and certified firefighters
21		employed by the Nation, subject to final negotiation of Joinder Agreements with
22		the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement System and approval of the
23		required sovereign immunity waiver and the related outside counsel's opinion
24		letter.
25		2. Approves the formation of two local boards, one for the Police Department and
26		one for the Fire Department, structured in accordance with A.R.S. 38-847, to
27		administer the Nation's participation in the state pension plan system.
28		3. Appropriates funds from gaming savings in an amount not to exceed
29		\$6,414,818.03 to pay the buy in amount in one lump sum, in an amount to be

1	determined by the Fund Manager of the Public Safety Personnel Retire	nent
2	System for the employees who are eligible at the time of joinder.	
3	4. Directs the trustees of the Nation's 401(k) retirement plan to prepare a	plan
4	amendment, with the assistance of their attorneys, which provides that, from	n the
5	date of participation in the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement Sy	stem
6	forward, the Nation's 5% employer contribution to the 401(k) retirement plan	and
7	the Nation's 2.5% employer matching contribution will be paid to the Ari	zona
8	Public Safety Personnel Retirement System for all eligible commissioned p	olice
9	officers and certified firefighters who join the state pension plan, instead o	finto
10	these employees' 401(k) accounts, which plan amendment shall be present	ed to
11	the Legislative Council for approval.	
12	5. Directs the trustees of the Nation's 401(k) retirement plan and the Accou	nting
13	Department to continue to pay the Nation's 5% employer contribution and t	neup
14	to 2.5% employer matching contribution into the 401(k) accounts of t	hose
15	employees in the Police Department and Fire Department who are not eligi	oleto
16	join the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement System, wit	hout
17	interruption.	
18	6. Understands that commissioned police officers and certified firefighters whe	join
19	the state pension plan will also retain 401(k) accounts with the Nat	ion's
20	retirement plan, and will be permitted to add employee voluntary contribu	tions
21	only to their 401(k) accounts while participating in the state pension plan	, and
22	that the Nation will return to paying its 5% employer contribution and the	up to
23	2.5% employer matching contribution to an employee's 401(k) account if	that
24	employee transfers out of the police department or fire department into and	other
25	job with the Nation.	
26	7. Authorizes the Treasurer of the Nation to transfer funds from gaming savir	ıgs in
27	an amount not to exceed \$6,414,818.03 to the general fund for the purpo	se of
28	funding and buying into the Arizona Public Safety Personnel Retirement Sys	stem,
29	pending approval of formal budget by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Cou	ncil.
