## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Opposing Arizona State Legislature House Bill 2680 Archaeological Discoveries; Private Lands) RESOLUTION NO. 06-115 WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation passed an Archaeological Resources Protection Ordinance (06-84) for the protection and preservation of cultural resources historically associated with traditional or sacred values and beliefs important to the O'odham and of the physical site, location or context in which cultural resources are found: and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the importance and need to protect, preserve and manage cultural and natural resources on the Nation's lands and on traditional-use lands located in most of Southern Arizona and Northern Sonora, Mexico; and WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the efforts of the State of Arizona to protect

whereas, the fonono O'odnam Nation recognizes the efforts of the State of Arizona to protect archaeological, palaeontological, historic sites and objects and human burials, specifically through Arizona Revised Statutes 41-844 and 41-865; and

WHEREAS, House Bill 2680, under consideration in the Arizona State Legislature, proposes to amend current state law, Arizona Revised Statute 41-844 that if approved in its present form has strong potential to remove existing protection under A.R.S. 41-844 and 41-865 that provide for the protection of archaeological, palaeontological and historic sites and objects and human burials; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned that HB 2680 in its present forms does not address serious issues relating to the overall problem of the ongoing destruction of archaeological sites on private lands occurring in Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned that HB 2680 does not address the need to increase penalties for those who loot and rob Arizona's cultural heritage sites.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation strongly opposes the passage of Arizona House Bill 2680 in its present form.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the <u>22<sup>ND</sup>.</u> Day of <u>FEBRUARY, 2006</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,440.80</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST</u>; <u>-0-NOT VOTING</u>; and <u>[02]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (i) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
