

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Requesting Assistance From Indian Health Service, Personnel Deployment to Address
Tohono O'odham Nation Disease Outbreaks in Cooperation with Tohono O'odham
Department of Health and Human Services)

RESOLUTION NO. 07-162

1 **WHEREAS, the Legislative Council is vested with the authority to provide "laws, ordinances, and**
2 **resolutions . . . to promote, protect, and provide for public health, peace, morals,**
3 **education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and**
4 **to consult with "federal agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono**
5 **O'odham Nation" (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article VI, Section**
6 **1(c)(2) and (j)); and**

7 **WHEREAS, as the United States Congress has recognized, "Federal health services to maintain**
8 **and improve the health of the Indians are consonant with and required by the**
9 **Federal Government's historical and unique legal relationship with, and resulting**
10 **responsibility to, the American Indian people" (25 U.S.C. Section 1601(a)); and**

11 **WHEREAS, although "the unmet health needs of the American Indian people are severe and the**
12 **health status of the Indians is far below that of the general population of the United**
13 **States," the United States, in the fulfillment of its trust obligation to Indian people,**
14 **has made it a goal "to provide the quantity and quality of health services which will**
15 **permit the health status of Indians to be raised to the highest possible level and to**
16 **encourage the maximum participation of Indians in the planning and management**
17 **of those services" (25 U.S.C. Section 1601(d) and (b)); and**

18 **WHEREAS, in order to address the unmet health care needs of the Tohono O'odham and**
19 **participate in the planning and management of such services, the Tohono O'odham**
20 **Nation ("Nation") has established, funds, and staffs the Tohono O'odham Department**
21 **of Health and Human Services ("TODHHS"), which provides critical health services for**
22 **dialysis, family assistance, food distribution, tuberculosis, diabetes, infectious**
23 **diseases, senior services, child welfare, special needs, health transportation, social**
24 **services, adult care, children's home, and family preservation (Tohono O'odham**
25 **Executive Branch 2004 Administrative Plan, as adopted by Resolution No. 03-567); and**

26 **WHEREAS, it is essential for the TODHHS to obtain timely health-related information from all**
27 **available sources in order to adequately address public health issues of the Nation's**
28 **members; and**

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1 **WHEREAS, although the Indian Health Service ("IHS") receives and discloses information**
2 **concerning sexually transmitted diseases contracted by Nation's members to Arizona**
3 **governmental agencies, the IHS has recently declined to share such information with**
4 **the TODHHS, which employs infectious disease staff, and has questioned whether the**
5 **Nation or TODHHS is a "public health authority" eligible to receive such information**
6 **under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, P.L. 104-191**
7 **("HIPAA"); and**

8 **WHEREAS, the HIPAA authorizes disclosures of protected health information to a public health**
9 **authority, which is defined as "an agency or authority of . . . an Indian tribe, or a**
10 **person or entity acting under a grant of authority from or contract with such public**
11 **agency, including the employees or agents of such public agency or its contractors or**
12 **persons or entities to whom it has granted authority, that is responsible for public**
13 **health matters as part of its official mandate" (45 C.F.R. § 164.501); and**

14 **WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 07-100 the Nation (1) designated the TODHHS, which is responsible**
15 **for public health matters as part of its official mandate, as the Nation's public health**
16 **authority and (2) affirmed that the TODHHS is eligible to receive protected health**
17 **information and otherwise perform all functions of a public health authority in**
18 **accordance with applicable law; and**

19 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council (1) designated the TODHHS, which is**
20 **responsible for public health matters as part of its official mandate, as the Nation's**
21 **public health authority and (2) affirmed that the TODHHS is eligible to receive**
22 **protected health information and otherwise perform all functions of a public health**
23 **authority in accordance with applicable law Constitutional Authority: Article VI,**
24 **Section 1(c)(2) and (j).**

25 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby:**

- 26 **(1) Recognizes that there is a concern for Sexually Transmitted Disease outbreak.**
27 **(2) Urges the Tucson Area of the Indian Health Service, including its Sells Hospital**
28 **and all other I.H.S. units, to obtain the State process and strongly urges the State**
29 **to declare an outbreak.**
30 **(3) Urge the Tucson Area, Indian Health Services, Sells Hospital to request for Public**
31 **Health deployment of Personnel to assist Tucson Area, Indian Health Services,**

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Sells Hospital in Sexually Transmitted Disease case investigation, individual prevention education, and contact investigation in conjunction with TODHHS.
(4) To develop a joint Indian Health Service and Tohono O'odham Nation Prevention Plan to address future Disease outbreaks.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 12TH Day of MARCH, 2007 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,821.1 FOR; 342.1 AGAINST; 84.5 NOT VOTING; and 193.1[06] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (c)(2)&(j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).



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
