RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Approving Lease to Mary A. Garcia for Pisinemo Trading Post and Donating Existing Buildings)

		RESOLUTION NO. <u>07-246</u>
1	WHEREAS,	since 1974 the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") leased land to the Robinette family
2		for the Pisinemo Trading Post, including the December 1994 lease to Travis Robinette
3		which expired on November 30, 2004, at which time the Robinette family vacated the
4		premises; and
5	WHEREAS,	on December 1, 2004, under the terms of the lease, the buildings which had been
6		constructed by the Robinette family became the property of the Nation; and
7	WHEREAS,	Pisinemo District ("District") notified the Nation that the District desired that the
8		store continue to operate, in part because it housed a United States Post Office which
9		Pisinemo community relied upon; and
10	WHEREAS,	in November 2004 Mary A. Garcia purchased the store contents and fixtures from
11		the Robinette family and presented a proposal to the District and the Nation to
12		continue to operate the store and post office, subject to the willingness of the Nation
13		to lease the land and the buildings to her; and
14	WHEREAS,	on November 23, 2004 the Nation's Realty Office provided Mary A. Garcia a letter
15		authorizing her to occupy the buildings and to operate the store and post office until
16		a lease from the Nation could be finalized; and
17	WHEREAS,	in 2005 the Nation's facilities management department performed an inspection
18		of the buildings and advised that the Pisinemo Trading Post building was in bad
19		condition, would be expensive to repair, and should simply be condemned; and
20	WHEREAS,	in 2005 and 2006 the Nation discussed several options with the District and Mary A.
21		Garcia to allow the store and post office to continue in operation, but the lease to Mary
22		A. Garcia was never completed; and
23	WHEREAS,	in January 2007 Mary A. Garcia presented a proposal to the Nation which proposed
24		that, if the Nation would transfer ownership of the buildings to her, Mary A. Garcia
25		would, over time, demolish and rebuild the store building and the residence at her
26		own expense; and
27	WHEREAS,	after considering the proposal, the Natural Resources Committee recommends that
28		the Nation transfer ownership of the store and residence buildings to Mary A. Garcia

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1	and allow her to demolish and rebuild the store and residence buildings at her own
2	expense, and recommends that the Nation lease the land to her for ten years, with an
3	option to renew for an additional five years after an opportunity to renegotiate the
4	rental price; and
5	WHEREAS, the lease to Mary A. Garcia provides for the first two years at \$1.00 per year renta
6	payment, and in year three through year ten payment of \$1,200.00 per year to the
7	Treasurer of the Nation, for the benefit of Pisinemo District; and
8	WHEREAS,the Robinette lease had also provided for rental revenues to go to Pisinemo District
9	and
10	WHEREAS, because Pisinemo District has plans to pave a dirt road on the east side of the
11	Trading Post property, the eastern and western boundaries of the property need to be
12	moved 30 feet to the west, which is agreeable to Mary A. Garcia.
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:
14	1. Hereby donates the Pisinemo Trading Post store and residence buildings to Mary
15	A. Garcia, effective as of the effective date of this resolution, along with any liability
16	from use of the buildings which may arise after the effective date of this resolution,
17	so that she can, over time, demolish and rebuild them as a trading post;
18	2. Agrees that the Nation will move the boundary fence 30 feet to the west on the
19	eastern and western boundaries, in accordance with the property description
20	incorporated into the lease which is attached hereto;
21	3. Approves the Business Lease for 0.971 acres of land substantially in the form
22	attached hereto, which provides for two years of rent at \$1.00 per year, followed by
23	an annual rent of \$1,200.00 per year for the remaining eight years of the term, at
24	which time the rent may be renegotiated by the parties for an additional term of
25	five years;
26	4. Agrees that the rental revenues will go to Pisinemo District;
27	5. Agrees that the Nation waives the right to any performance or payment bond
28	required by the federal regulations; and
29	6. Authorizes the Chairperson of the Nation to execute the lease and to provide any
