4	for Sex Offender Registration and Notification to implement Subtitle A of the Adam

6	WHEREAS, in their current form, the Guidelines
7	(1) allow the Attorney General to delegate a tribe's registration and notification
8	functions to a state government if the tribe has not substantially complied with
9	the requirements of the Act, but fails to provide a standard for measuring such
10	noncompliance;
11	(2) allow a registration jurisdiction to ignore tribal court sex offense convictions if
12	the jurisdiction determines the tribal court defendant was denied the right to
13	counsel despite the fact that the right to counsel is guaranteed by the Indian Civil
14	Rights Act;
15	(3) automatically classifies all tribal court sex offense conviction as "tier I" offenses,
16	the least dangerous classification; and
17	(4) does not require federal correctional facilities, where a large proportion of
18	Indian Country sex offenders are housed, to register sex offenders, despite the
19	fact that <i>all</i> corrections facilities must "ensure" registration of sex offenders
20	prior to their release under the Adam Walsh Act; and
21	WHEREAS, it is in the Nation's interest to comment on the Proposed National Guidelines for Sex
22	Offender Registration and Notification.
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby adopts
24	the Tohono O'odham Nation's Comments on the Proposed National Guidelines for Sex
