## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Opposing BIA "Modernization Initiative" as Undermining Federal Trust Obligation to Indian People)

RESOLUTION NO. 07-685

1	WHEREAS,	sovereign indian tribes, including the Tonono O'odnam Nation, share a unique trust
2		$relations hip with the {\bf United States of America, which is embodied in the Constitution}$
3		of the  United  States, numerous  court  opinions, statutes, executive  orders, and  federal
4		agency policies; and
5	WHEREAS,	by its passage and implementation of the Indian Self-Determination and Education
6		Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. § 450 et seq.) and similar legislation, the United States of
7		America has recognized the need to work with Indian tribes on a government-to-
8		government basis and to support Indian tribal self-determination and self-
9		governance; and
10	WHEREAS,	Executive Order 13175, "Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribal
11		$Governments "("Consultation Order"), mandates that {\tt Executive Branch agencies work}$
12		$with \ tribes \ when \ formulating \ and \ implementing \ policies \ or \ taking \ other \ actions \ that$
13		have a substantial direct effect on any Indian tribe; and
14	WHEREAS,	the Consultation Order and other executive orders and memoranda require that
15		Executive agencies ensure that there is "meaningful" and "timely" tribal input when
16		formulating policies that have tribal implications; and
17	WHEREAS,	in response to the Cobell v. Kempthorne class action lawsuit, the Department of
18	·	Interior ("DOI") has planned and executed numerous reorganizations of Indian
19		programs within and outside the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA"), often without
20		meaningful or timely tribal input and despite tribal objections; and
21	WHEREAS,	such efforts are frequently presented by individuals with little or no expertise in the
22		Indian trust programs, or who prioritize the development of Indian resources over
23		performance of the federal government's trust responsibilities; and

26	WHEREAS,	most recently, a "modernization initiative" is being promoted by Office of Indian
27		Energy and Economic Development Director Robert Middleton, who served on the
28		Presidential Task Force on Energy Project Streamlining with former energy lobbyist
29		and DOI Deputy Secretary J. Steven Griles; and

1	WHEREAS,	Mr. Griles, who had significant responsibility for the DOI's previous Indian trust asset
2		management reorganization, subsequently pleaded guilty to obstruction of justice for
3		lying to the Congress; and
4	WHEREAS,	in violation of the Consultation Order and the principles of self-determination, the
5		Tohono O'odham Nation and other tribes have received no meaning ful description of the property of the pro
6		the  modernization  initiative, its  impacts, or  the  true  basis  for  pushing  it  forward;  and  it  forward;  a
7	WHEREAS,	instead, at a  September  26, 2007  We stern  Region  meeting  to  present  the  initiative, Mr.  and  an extended a constant of the extended constant of the
8		Middleton provided tribes with a vague presentation that failed to disclose the
9		initiative's details or its rationale; and
10	WHEREAS,	in response, Western Region tribes (1) refused the DOI's request to support further
11		reductions in Indian programs and services by helping recommend additional BIA
12		budget cuts for FY 2009 and (2) opposed the modernization initiative or similar BIA
13		reorganizations on grounds that such efforts are designed to save the federal
14		government money at the expense of diminished services to tribes and fewer
15		resources to carry out federal Indian trust obligations; and
16	WHEREAS,	${\bf Mr.Middletonrespondedtothetriballeaders'descriptionofbudgetcutsbysayingthe}$
17		leaders present did not understand the federal budget process; and
18	WHEREAS,	to the contrary, the BIA's own budget requests fully support the tribes' position: the
19		BIA requested a -2.3% change in its FY 2005 budget over the previous fiscal year, a -
20		4.7% change in FY 2006, a -2.3% change in FY 2007, and a -3.4% change in FY 2008; and
21	WHEREAS,	history likewise supports the leaders' conclusion that reorganizations hurt Indian
22		programs and squander millions of dollars; and
23	WHEREAS,	the BIA has spent more than \$40 million on the dysfunctional Trust Asset Accounting
24		and Management System ("TAAMS") and over \$100 million to improve its Indian trust
25		systems, but  remains  in accessible  by  Internet  due  to  in a dequate  system  security;  and  depends on the contraction of the
26	WHEREAS,	on September 26, 2007 DOI Inspector General Earl E. Devaney reported that his office
27		had launched an investigation into a \$149 million Minerals Management Service
28		computer system that could be considered a "profound failure," a system that is
29		responsible for handling over \$8billioninoilandgaspaymentsonfederalandIndian
30		lands; and

1	WHEREAS, the DOI, whose overall computer system has been rated one of the worst in the
2	government due to lax security, has spent hundreds of millions of dollars on faulty or
3	failed systems affecting Indian trust assets; and
4	WHEREAS, the DOI is now planning to further reorganize Indian programs without truly
5	consulting or communicating with Indian tribes, despite the fact that its latest
6	initiative will continue the pattern of funding reductions at the agency level and a
7	corresponding decrease in trust-related services to Indian people; and
8	WHEREAS, in light of this history, the modernization initiative can only be viewed as another
9	attempt to diminish and undermine the federal government's Indian trust
10	responsibilities.

12	the BIA "modernization initiative" and urges that, in the absence of clear objectives,
13	meaningful tribal input, or any plausible rationale that the initiative will help the DOI
14	better perform its trust obligations to Indian people, that the initiative be withdrawn
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby urges the
16	members of the United States Congress to reject any reduction in the FY 2009 BIA
ا7	budget.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation is hereby authorized
19	to execute and forward letters to DOI Secretary Kempthorne, Assistant Secretary for
20	Indian Affairs Carl Artman, the Native American Rights Fund, and members of the
21	Arizona delegation to the United States Congress opposing the modernization
22	initiative, and urging that it be withdrawn and that no further initiative-related action
23	be taken without meaningful tribal consultation.
24	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes and directs its
25	delegation to the 2007 Annual Session of the National Congress of American Indians
26	("NCAI") to submit this resolution to NCAI for its approval.
