RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting Relisting of the Sonoran Desert Bald Eagle under the Endangered Species Act)

RESOLUTION NO. <u>08-395</u>

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is vested with the power to preserve and
2		protect wildlife of the Tohono O'odham Nation as well as the power to consult with
3		the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal agencies regarding
4		federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation (Article VI, Section 1(f),
5		1(i)(2), and (j) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation); and
6	WHEREAS,	the Bald Eagle is revered and holds an integral and sacred position for and within
7		the Tohono O'odham Nation and indigenous communities throughout the United
8		States and has also become a national symbol for the United States; and
9	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approved Resolution No. 07-270, "Opposing
10		Delisting of the Bald Eagle and Urging United States Fish and Wildlife Service to List
11		Desert Nesting Bald Eagle as Distinct Population Segment" in opposition of United
12))	States Fish and Wildlife's ("FWS") proposed rule to delist (remove) the Bald Eagle
13		from the threatened species list under the Endangered Species Act ("ESA"); and
14	WHEREAS,	the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service issued a final rule on July 9, 2007, effective August
15		8, 2007 that removed all bald eagles throughout the contiguous 48 states from the
16		threatened species list under the ESA; and
17	WHEREAS,	in a March 6, 2008 court order, U.S. District Court for the District of Arizona (Center
18		for Biological Diversity v. Kempthorne, CV 07-0038-PHX-MHM), the court
19	Q.	temporarily reinstated the listing of the bald eagle as a threatened species, but only
20		with respect to the eagles that reside in the Sonoran Desert of central Arizona,
21	y.	effective March 6, 2008; and
22	WHEREAS,	the court further ordered the Fish and Wildlife Service to: 1) conduct a status review
23		to determine whether recognizing the Sonoran Desert bald eagle population as a
24		Distinct Population Segment (DPS) is warranted, and if so, whether listing the DPS
25	U	as threatened or end angered pursuant to the End angered Species Act is warranted;
26		and 2) issue by December 5, 2008, a 12-month finding on the results of the status
27		review; and
28	WHEREAS,	in a letter dated June 19, 2008 the Fish and Wildlife Service Regional Director has
29		extended an invitation to the Tohono O'odham Nation to attend a July 3, 2008 multi-
30		agency tribal consultation in Phoenix.

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby:
2	1. Calls upon the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to engage in meaningful
3	and formal government-to-government consultation with the Tohono
4	O'odham Nation and other Arizona tribes during its status review of the
5	Sonoran Desert bald eagle population pursuant to its trust responsibilities
6	under Secretarial Order 3206.
7	2. Urges the United States Fish and Wildlife Service to relist the Sonoran Desert
8	bald eagle as a Distinct Population Segment under the protection of the
9	Endangered Species Act upon completion of its status review.
10	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation along with members
11	of the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council are authorized and directed to take all
12	necessary steps to communicate and advocate the Nation's position with all federal
13	agencies and officials.
14	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 27^{TH} . Day
15	of JUNE, 2008 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,217.6 FOR; -0-AGAINST;
16	-0- NOT VOTING; and 316.9 [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section
17	1 (f)(i)(2) & (j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the
18	Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant
19	Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
20	18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
