## **RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** (Adopting Comparative Effectiveness Research Recommendations and Comments for

Submission to the Federal Coordinating Council)

# RESOLUTION NO. 09-337

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation authorizes the Legislative Council to
2		"promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals education and general
3		welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and to "consult with
4		appropriate federal agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono
5		O'odham Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2), and Section 1(j)); and
6	WHEREAS,	sovereign Indian tribes, including the Tohono O'odham Nation, share a unique trust
7		relationship with the United States of America, which is embodied in the Constitution
8		of the United States, numerous court opinions, statutes, executive orders, and federal
9		agency policies; and
10	WHEREAS,	as the United States Congress has recognized, "Federal health services to maintain
11		and improve the health of the Indians are consonant with and required by the Federal
12		Government's historical and unique legal relationship with, and resulting
13		responsibility to, the American Indian people." (25 U.S.C. Section 1601(a)); and
14	WHEREAS,	although "the unmet health needs of the American Indian people are severe and the
15		health status of the Indians is far below that of the general population of the United
16		States," the United States, in the fulfillment of its trust obligation to Indian people, has
17		made it a goal "to provide the quantity and quality of health services which will permit
18		the health status of Indians to be raised to the highest possible level and to encourage
19		the maximum participation of Indians in the planning and management of those
20		services." (25 U.S.C. Section 1601(d) and (b)); and
21	WHEREAS,	on November 6, 2000 President William J. Clinton issued Executive Order 13175,
22		"Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribal Governments" ("Consultation
23		Order"), thereby mandating that Executive Branch agencies work with tribes when
24		formulating and implementing policies or taking other actions that have a substantial
25		direct effect on any Indian tribe; and
26	WHEREAS,	the Consultation Order and earlier executive orders and memoranda require that all
27		Executive agencies ensure that there is "meaningful" and "timely" tribal input when
28		formulating policies that have tribal implications; and
29	WHEREAS,	Section 804 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA")(Public
30		Law No. 111-5) establishes the Federal Coordinating Council for Comparative
31		${\it EffectivenessResearchto``fosteroptimumcoordinationofcomparativeeffectiveness}$
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1		and related health services research conducted or supported by relevant Federal
2		departments and agencies"; and
3	WHEREAS,	comparative effectiveness research is tentatively defined by the Federal Coordinating
4		Council to be "the conduct and synthesis of systemic research comparing different
5		interventions and strategies to prevent, diagnose, treat and monitor health conditions
6		"(FCCDraftDefinition <u>http://www.hhs.gov/recovery/programs/cer/draftdefinition/</u>
7		html); and
8	WHEREAS,	the Federal Coordinating Council held a "listening session" on April 14 <sup>th</sup> to "hear public
9		comments regarding comparative effectiveness research" and has scheduled another
10		"listening session" for June 10, 2009 so that members of the public and stakeholders
11		can submit their comments; and
12	WHEREAS,	the Federal Coordinating Council is required to submit an initial report to President
13		Obama and Congress with information about current activities on comparative
14		effectiveness research and recommendations for research conducted or supported
15		from ARRA funds no later than June 30, 2009; and
16	WHEREAS,	it is essential that Indian tribes including the Tohono O'odham Nation be involved in
17		efforts to coordinate health-related research that will affect Indian peoples, that may
18		evaluate alternative and traditional healing methods, and that will ultimately affect
19		health services to all Native Americans; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation has several issues and concerns regarding comparative
21		effectiveness research, summarized in the "Tohono O'odham Nation
22		ARRA/Comparative Effectiveness Research Recommendations," ("CER
23		Recommendations") which is incorporated by this reference, about how the research
24		is conducted and the application of the research's results and possible effects on the
25		quantity and quality of healthcare provided to members of the Nation; and
26	WHEREAS,	submission of the CER Recommendations to the Federal Coordinating Council will
27		express the Nation's concerns and recommendations regarding comparative
28		effectiveness research, provide meaningful and timely input, and reinforce the federal
29		government's trust obligation to maintain and improve the health of Indians,
30		including members of the Tohono O'odham Nation.
31	NOW, THEF	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it adopts the
32		"Tohono O'odham Nation ARRA/Comparative Effectiveness Research
33		Recommendations" as the Nation's official comments and recommendations for

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1	submission to the Federal Coordinating Council for Comparative Effectiveness		
2	Research.		
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes and		
4	directs the Nation's Chairperson to submit the "Tohono O'odham Nation		
5	ARRA/Comparative Effectiveness Research Recommendations" to the Federal		
6	Coordinating Council by June 10, 2009.

Day of <u>JUNE, 2009</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,098.55</u> FOR; <u>298.25</u> AGAINST; <u>02</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>198.7 [02]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI Section <u>1(c)(2)&amp;(j)</u> of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
