

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Supporting the Tohono O'odham Nation's Infrastructure Improvements for the  
Various Local School Jurisdictions to Improve the Safety for Our Nation's Youth)**

**RESOLUTION NO. 10-199**

1 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation's Planning Department presented to Tohono O'odham**  
2 **Legislative Council the Safe Routes to School Program and the Sells Safe Routes to**  
3 **School Project; and**

4 **WHEREAS, the primary reason for developing this nationwide program is to address the growing**  
5 **epidemic of childhood obesity and diabetes throughout the United States and here on**  
6 **the Tohono O'odham Nation; and**

7 **WHEREAS, there is also serious concern for the well-being and safety of the students who cross**  
8 **State Route 86 to arrive at Indian Oasis Baboquivari Unified School District, and other**  
9 **various school jurisdictions; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the Sells Community passed Resolution SC-42-10 supporting infrastructure**  
11 **improvements along State Route 86 to increase the safety of students who walk to**  
12 **school; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Sells District passed Resolution SD-32-10 which also supports infrastructure**  
14 **improvements along State Route 86 to increase the safety of students who walk to**  
15 **school and additionally resolves that the speed limit on State Route 86 be reduced to**  
16 **35 miles per hour; and**

17 **WHEREAS, the Sells Safe Routes to School Program and the Sells Community Resolution SC-42-10**  
18 **and Sells District Resolution SD-32-10 were presented to the oversight committees**  
19 **Natural Resources, Human Resources Development, Commerce and Budget and**  
20 **Finance.**

21 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports**  
22 **infrastructure improvements along State Route 86, for all school jurisdictions located**  
23 **on the Tohono O'odham Nation, including the installation of crosswalks and other**  
24 **safety measures, to ensure the safety and well-being of our Nation's youth.**

25 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 08<sup>TH</sup> Day**  
26 **of JUNE, 2010 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,595.50 FOR; -0- AGAINST;**  
27 **-0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI,**  
28 **Section 1 (2) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham**  
29 **Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs**  
30 **(Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
