13		establishment of a Tribal Historic Preservation Office ("THPO"); and
14	WHEREAS,	the  Tohono O'odham Legislative Council passed Resolution No. 08-249, to approve the Council passed Resolution No. 08-249, to approve
15		Nation's application to establish a THPO as part of the Nation's Cultural Affairs
16		Program to, in part, ensure Section 106 compliance pursuant to NHPA for the
17		protection  and  preservation  of archaeological  resources  historically  associated   with   in the contrast of

24		States Department of the Interior, National Park Service (NPS) on August 7, 2009 for
25		the assumption by the Nation of certain responsibilities, including responsibilities
26		related to the establishment of a THPO for the Nation; and

3	WHEREAS, the Natural Resources Committee, Cultural Preservation Committee and the Domestic
4	Affairs Committee has reviewed and approves the MOA for the Proposed FHA / ADOT
5	Road Widening Project on Arizona; and
6	WHEREAS, the Nation's THPO has reviewed and approves the MOA and Treatment Plan report;

8	WHEREAS, the Nation's Attorney General's Office reviewed and approves, as to form, the MOA.
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council does hereby
10	approve the MOA, in substantially the form attached hereto, for the Road Widening
11	project along Arizona State Route 86 Between Mileposts 137.10 and 141.10 (Project No.
12	086-STP 086-A A(200)A – TRACS No. 086 PM 137 H7403 01C) pursuant to Section 106 of
13	the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (NHPA, 16 U.S.C. 470f, 36 CFR 800.2
14	(c)(1)(i), and 800.6(b)) and authorizes the Tohono O'odham Nation Tribal Historic
15	Preservation Officer to sign the MOA for the Road Widening Project along State Route
16	86 between Mileposts 137.10 and 141.10, Tohono O'odham Nation, Pima County,
17	Arizona.
