4	addressing violent crime and maximize interagency cooperation; and
5	WHEREAS, the mission of this program is for participating agencies to conduct in-depth
6	investigations of firearms related crimes, to identify and target for prosecution the
7	perpetrators of such crimes (i.e. criminal street gangs, armed career criminals,
8	firearms traffickers, and armed narcotics traffickers); and

10	participating agency; and
11	WHEREAS, this MOU may be amended, modified or reviewed in writing and such amendment,
12	modification or revision with the signature of an authorized official of each
13	participating agency.
14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby
15	accepts the Memorandum of Understanding for the Tohono O'odham Nation Police
16	Department with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives as attached
17	hereto.
18	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby authorizes the
19	Chairman of the Nation to sign and execute the MOU with the Bureau of Alcohol,
20	Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives provided that any amendments shall be submitted
21	for approval by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council.
