

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving the Memorandum of Agreement between the Tohono O'odham Nation and the
U.S. Department of Homeland Security Domestic Nuclear Detection Office)

RESOLUTION NO. 10-412

1 **WHEREAS, the potential of a chemical, biological, radiological, and/or nuclear attack within the**
2 **United States is a real threat that would have a catastrophic effect on all citizens**
3 **throughout the country; and**

4 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation's border with Mexico is among the areas of concern for**
5 **the introduction into the United States of the materials needed for such an attack; and**

6 **WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Domestic Nuclear Detection Office has**
7 **developed a program called Preventative Radiological Nuclear Detection (PRND) to**
8 **increase the detection and deterrence of these materials that may be smuggled across**
9 **the border; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office has approached various public safety agencies**
11 **along the southern Arizona border, including the Tohono O'odham Nation to**
12 **participate in the PRND program; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Public Safety programs of the Police**
14 **Department, Fire Department and Office of Emergency Management has concluded**
15 **that participation in this program would increase the capabilities of the public safety**
16 **programs and increase the safety of the citizens and members that they serve; and**

17 **WHEREAS, the participation in the PRND program requires a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)**
18 **with the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office for the receipt of free training and**
19 **equipment; and**

20 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Public Safety has submitted a**
21 **Memorandum of Agreement to the Domestic Affairs Committee which recommends**
22 **the MOA for approval by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council.**

23 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the**
24 **Memorandum of Agreement with the U. S. Department of Homeland Security Domestic**
25 **Nuclear Detection Office and the Tohono O'odham Nation substantially in the form**
26 **attached hereto and authorizes the Chairman of the Nation to execute it.**

27 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 12TH Day**
28 **of OCTOBER, 2010 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,390.80 FOR; -0-**
29 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 204.70[03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
30 **Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono**
31 **O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -**
32 **Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48**
33 **Stat. 984).**
