11	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation applied for and was awarded the U.S. Department
12		of Justice (DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Hiring
13		Program grant, grant no. 2013-UM-WX-0010; and
14	WHEREAS,	this grant was accepted by Tohono O'odham Legislative Council Resolution No.
15		14-062; and
16	WHEREAS,	the grant requires the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department to develop
17		and maintain a Memorandum of Understanding with schools that will be served
18		by a School Resource Officer; and
19	WHEREAS,	Memorandums of Understanding have been negotiated with the following
20		schools and reviewed by the Domestic Affairs Committee which recommends
