LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Directing Submission of "Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony Disqualification Referendum" to Nation's Voters During 2015 General Election)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 15-074

1	WHEREAS,	"The Tohono O'odham Council shall enact an election ordinance which shall
2		prescribe the qualifications of candidates and such other rules and
3		procedures necessary to the orderly conduct of elections, including but not
4		limited to procedures for validation of petitions and the settlement of any and
5		all election disputes. The decision of the Tohono O'odham Council in all
6		election matters, including the eligibility and qualifications of candidates, shall
7		be final." (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article X, Section 7); and
8	WHEREAS,	after spending several years drafting amendments to the Nation's Uniform
9		Election Ordinance, conducting public hearings across the Nation, submitting
10		multiple drafts for public comment, and reviewing more than 100 written and
11		oral comments, the Legislative Rules Committee submitted comprehensive
12		Election Ordinance amendments to the Legislative Council for consideration in
13		2012; and
14	WHEREAS,	the comprehensive amendments included provisions to disqualify convicted
15		felons from running for or being appointed as district council chairperson or
16		vice-chairperson, Legislative Council representative or alternate, or Nation's
17		chairperson or vice-chairperson but would not apply to candidates for district
18		council representative or alternate; and
19	WHEREAS,	the amendments were passed by the Legislative Council in 2012 but were vetoed
20		and the felony disqualification amendments were withdrawn prior to the
21		enactment of 12 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1 - Elections in 2013; and
22	WHEREAS,	members of the public, Legislative Council representatives, and the Nation's
23		chairman recommended that the Nation's voters be given the opportunity to
24		vote on the felony disqualification amendments; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council shall, "either at the direction of the Council itself, or
26		upon receipt of a petition signed by not less than three hundred registered
27		voters of the Tohono O'odham Nation, submit any enacted or proposed
28		ordinance, resolution or other national legislation to a referendum of the
29		registered voters." (Constitution, Article XIV); and
30	WHEREAS,	in 2015 the Legislative Rules Committee compiled the felony disqualification
31		amendments within the "Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony
32		Disqualification Referendum," redistributed the provisions to the public, and
33		presented the Referendum during additional public hearings; and

Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony Disqualification Referendum, 5 which is incorporated by this reference. 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council directs the 7 submission of the Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony 8 Disqualification Referendum to the Nation's voters during the May 23, 2015 9 10 general election. BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to 12 T.O.C. Chapter 1, Section 11311(B), all Legislative 11 Council representatives shall be provided an opportunity to comment on the 12 draft analysis of the Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony 13 Disqualification Referendum and to submit popular arguments favoring and 14 opposing the Referendum. 15 BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Legislative Rules Committee shall compile comments and 16 arguments without attribution to individual representatives and provide them 17 for Council approval and submission to the Election Board in accordance with 18 19 12 T.O.C. Chapter 1, Section 11311. BE IT FINALLY ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council's action submitting the 20 Upholding Integrity in Tribal Leadership: Felony Disqualification Referendum 21 22 pursuant to Article XIV of the Constitution and does not represent the Council's 23 support for or opposition to the Referendum. The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 31^{ST} day of 24 MARCH, 2015 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,786.9 FOR; 159.6 25 AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by 26 Article VI, Section 1 and 1(a); Article X, Sect 7 and Article XIV of the Constitution of the Tohono 27 O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved 28 29 by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984). 30 31 32 33 34 35 egislative Chairman 36 37
