

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting Tohono O'odham Department of Health and Human Services' Grant
Application and Proposal to the United States Department of Health and
Human Services, Indian Health Service, Injury Prevention Program)

RESOLUTION NO. 15-240

1 **WHEREAS,** the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council
2 with the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace,
3 moral, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its
4 members" and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on
5 behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local
6 governments" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and (f)); and

7 **WHEREAS,** the prevention of injuries is a health priority for the Tohono O'odham Nation,
8 which has enacted several resolutions to that effect, including but not limited to
9 resolutions approving the development of education material for injury
10 prevention; "Enacting Seatbelt and Child Restraint Laws as Sections of the
11 Traffic Code of the Tohono O'odham Nation," which mandates the use of vehicle
12 restraints and child passenger restraint systems throughout the Nation; and
13 approving funding for Motor Vehicle Injury Prevention Project ("STOP Project")
14 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (Resolution No. 93-473,
15 Resolution No. 05-438, Resolution No. 06-850); and

16 **WHEREAS,** in response to Funding Announcement Number HHS-2015-IHS-IPP-0001, the
17 Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Health and Human Services has
18 prepared a grant application requesting \$100,000 for the first year and \$80,000
19 for the next four years from the Indian Health Service, Injury Prevention
20 Program to support the Tohono O'odham Wo Si-S-ap'e Nu:Kud ("Take Good Care
21 of Yourself") program; and

22 **WHEREAS,** the Health and Human Services Committee reviewed the grant proposal and
23 recommends the Council support the Department of Health and Human
24 Services' grant application and proposal.

25 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it
26 supports Tohono O'odham Department of Health and Human Services' proposal
27 and grant application for the Indian Health Service, Injury Prevention Program
28 grant; provided that any grant award and associated budget shall be subject to

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approval by Legislative Council resolution pursuant to Resolution No. 99-059,

"Approving a Process for Grant Fund Applications by the Executive Branch."

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 17TH day of JUNE, 2015 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,015.3 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(d)(2), (c)(2) and (f) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
