RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Authorizing Assumption of Remaining Federal Programs, Functions, Services and Activities Carried Out by the Indian Health Service for or in Support of the Nation)

RESOLUTION NO. 15-365

1	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has the authority "to promote, protect and provide for
2		public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono
3		O'odham Nation and its members" and to "consult, negotiate and conclude
4		agreements and contracts on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with
5		Federal, State and local governments" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)
6		and Section 1(f)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act of 1975 (Pub. L. No.
8		93-638; 25 U.S.C. § 450 et seq.) authorizes the Nation to assume federal programs,
9		functions, services or activities ("PFSAs") by self-determination contract
10		pursuant to Title I or by self-governance compact pursuant to Title V with the
11		Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; and
12	WHEREAS,	the Nation has previously entered into Contract No. HHS1249200400001C with
13		the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for the
14		management of certain health services; and
15	WHEREAS,	the Tucson Area Office and the Sells Service Unit, including the Sells Hospital,
16		the San Simon Health Center, the San Xavier Health Center, and the Santa Rosa
17		Health Center, are responsible for delivering critical healthcare resources to
18		the Nation's citizens; and
19	WHEREAS,	by Resolution 15-111, the Legislative Council authorized the Nation to plan and
20		evaluate for assuming the remaining federal PFSAs carried out by the Indian
21		Health Service for or in support of the Nation, together with any associated
22		tribal shares; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Nation has determined it is in the best interest of the Tohono O'odham
24		Nation to assume additional PFSAs that may include the PFSAs currently
25		operated at the Service Unit, Area, and Headquarters levels of IHS, together with
26		associated Tribal Shares; and
27	WHEREAS,	the Nation recognizes that IHS employees are critically important to the
28		continuity of care for the Nation's members and other IHS patients; and

1	WHEREAS,	it is the intent of the Legislative Council, to the greatest extent feasible, to
2		maintain stability in staffing of any PFSAs assumed by the Nation by offering the
3		opportunity to continue in federal employment to all current and eligible IHS
4		employees, using Intergovernmental Personnel Agreements, Memoranda of
5	<u> </u>	Agreements, or direct hire employment; and
6	WHEREAS,	the Nation is confident that the IHS Tucson Area and Sells Service Unit
7		leadership will work closely and cooperatively with the Nation to minimize staff
8		uncertainty and disruption, to disclose all pertinent information, to assist in the
9		development of all necessary legal documents, and to work collaboratively with
10		the Nation consistent with IHS's commitment to tribal self-governance and self-
11		determination; and
12	WHEREAS,	a planning process has been completed to the satisfaction of the Nation that
13		addressed legal and budgetary issues and internal government planning and
14		organizational preparation relating to the administration of health programs as
15		required by 42 C.F.R. § 137.20; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Nation has demonstrated financial stability and financial management
17		capacity; and
18	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has determined that it can most effectively meet the
19		needs of its members by negotiating for the assumption of all remaining Indian
20		Health Service programs, services, functions, and activities, or portions thereof
21		under Title V (Self-Governance); and
22	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has determined that, in the event the Nation is for any
23		reason ineligible to participate in self-governance under Title V of the Act, it will
24		proceed with contracting under Title I of the Act.
25	NOW, THERI	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes the
26		following:
27		1. The Nation's Chairperson may notify the IHS of the Nation's intent to assume
28		all remaining PFSAs that benefit the Nation; and

- 2. The Nation's Chairperson and/or his designee, and the Nation's legal counsel, are authorized and directed to develop the documents necessary for the Nation to assume operation of additional IHS PFSAs, which may include the PFSAs currently operated at the Service Unit, Area Office, and Headquarters levels of IHS, together with associated Tribal Shares; and
- 3. The Nation's Chairperson and/or his designee, and the Nation's legal counsel, may negotiate and submit to IHS, in coordination with the Health and Human Services Committee, a self-governance proposal or self-determination contract proposal for all remaining PFSAs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council wishes these negotiations to occur as early and expeditiously as possible and, subject to final approval of the Council.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all communication from the Indian Health Service regarding these negotiations shall be directed to the Nation's Chairperson with a copy to the Health Director and to the Nation's legal counsel, including the Office of Attorney General and the law firm of Sonosky Chambers Sachse Miller & Munson, LLP.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 17TH day of SEPTEMBER, 2015 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,021.4 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)and(f) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
