RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting H.R. 2811, "Save Oak Flat Act")

RESOLUTION NO. 15-373

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Tohono O'odham
2		Legislative Council with the power to preserve and cultivate native arts, crafts
3		and traditions and to consult with other Indian tribes, the United States
4		Congress, and with appropriate federal agencies regarding federal activities
5		that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(8),
6		1(f) and 1(j)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes that copper mining on traditional
8		native lands has frequently caused irreversible environmental damage,
9		destroyed archeological sites, native habitat, plants, and animals, and severely
10		contaminated aquifers and surface water; and
11	WHEREAS,	the United States government has legal and moral responsibilities to manage
12		traditional cultural territories in a way that shows respect for their cultural,
13		historical, spiritual and religious importance to Indian tribes and their quality
14		of life; and
15	WHEREAS,	for more than ten years, Congress considered and rejected proposed legislation
16	£	entitled the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act (the "Land
17		Exchange") that proposed a mandatory conveyance of National Forest Service
18		lands to Resolution Copper, a foreign-owned mining corporation, to conduct a
19		massive and unprecedented block cave copper mining project; and
20	WHEREAS,	the lands to be conveyed under the Land Exchange lie within the Tonto National
21		Forest and are known as "Oak Flat," which are the ancestral homelands of the
22		Apache, Yavapai, and other tribes in the region; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Land Exchange circumvents federal laws that mandate protection of native
24		religion and culture and federal laws that mandate protection of the
25		environment; and
26	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council by Resolution No. 11-551, the National
27		Congress of American Indians by Resolutions MKE-11-002 and MSP-15-001, the
28		Inter Tribal Council of Arizona, the United South and Eastern Tribes, the San
29		Carlos Apache Tribe, and other Arizona and New Mexico tribes have opposed the
30		Land Exchange because the proposal will destroy the religious and cultural
31	1	integrity of Oak Flat, and set a dangerous precedent for all of Indian Country by

RESOLUTION NO. 15-373 (Supporting H.R. 2811, "Save Oak Flat Act")) Page 2 of 3 conveying federal lands that encompass a known Apache sacred area to a private company for mining activities; and in the face of this opposition, supporters of the Land Exchange forced a WHEREAS, legislative rider onto the FY 2015 National Defense Authorization Act ("NDAA"), 4 which was enacted into law in December 2014 over the strong objections of the 5 San Carlos Apache Tribe and others throughout the nation; and 6 on July 6, 2015, Representative Raúl Grijalva introduced H.R. 2811, "Save Oak 7 WHEREAS. Flat Act," which repeals Section 3003 of the Fiscal Year 2015 National Defense 8 Authorization Act, the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange; and 9 the Cultural Preservation Committee recommends supporting the approval of 10 WHEREAS. H.R. 2811, "Save Oak Flat Act," which is in the Nation's best interest. 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council strongly 12 supports H.R. 2811, "Save Oak Flat Act" for the repeal of Section 3003 of the Fiscal 13 Year 2015 National Defense Authorization Act, the Southeast Arizona Land 14 Exchange. 15 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council reaffirms its position 16 in Resolution No. 11-551 to oppose any and all proposals that would authorize 17 the mining and desecration of Oak Flat and other sacred lands. 18 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 17^{TH} 19 day of <u>SEPTEMBER</u>, 2015 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>3,021,4</u> 20 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the 21 Council by Article VI, Section 1(c)(8), 1(f) and 1(j) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham 22 Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the 23 Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to 24 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984). 25 26 27 ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 28 29 30 31 Legislative Chairman 32 33 day of 34 35
