# **RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** (Urging the Continued Meaningful Implementation of Executive Order 13175 "Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribal Governments")

## **RESOLUTION NO. 16-213**

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3	F	education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4	;	and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation"
6		(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and
7	WHEREAS,	sovereign Indian tribes, including the Tohono O'odham Nation, share a unique
8		trust relationship with the United States of America, which is embodied in the
9		Constitution of the United States, numerous court opinions, statutes, executive
10		orders, and federal agency policies; and
11	WHEREAS,	by its passage and implementation of the Indian Self-Determination and
12		Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. § 450 et seq.) and similar legislation, the
13		United States of America has recognized the need to work with Indian tribes on a
14		government-to-government basis and to support Indian tribal self-
15		determination and self-governance; and
16	WHEREAS,	Executive Order 13175 "Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribal
17		Governments" ("Consultation Order"), mandates that Executive Branch agencies
18		ensure meaningful and timely input by tribal officials when formulating and
19		implementing policies or taking other actions that have substantial direct effects
20		on one or more Indian tribes; and
21	WHEREAS,	President Barack H. Obama's November 5, 2009 Presidential Memorandum on
22		Tribal Consultation ("Presidential Memorandum") committed executive
23		departments and agencies "to regular and meaningful consultation and
24		collaboration with tribal officials in policy decisions that have tribal
25		implications" in order to strengthen the government-to-government
26		relationship between the United States and Indian tribes; and
27	WHEREAS,	the Presidential Memorandum also recognizes that "failure to include the voices
28		of tribal officials in formulating policy affecting their communities has all too
29		often led to undesirable and, at times, devastating and tragic results"; and

1	WHEREAS,	with less than a full year left for President Obama's administration, the Tobono
2		O'odham Nation is concerned about the continued meaningful implementation
3		of the Consultation Order and Presidential Memorandum, which have both
4		greatly benefitted tribal nations and strengthened the government-to-
5		government relationship between the federal government and tribal nations;
6		and
7	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Health and Human Services Committee strongly recommends
8		unifying all tribal nations at the National Congress of American Indians' ("NCAI")
9		2016 Mid-Year Conference and Marketplace to advocate for the continued
10		meaningful implementation of the Consultation Order and Presidential
11		Memorandum by the next presidential administration.
12	NOW, THERE	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it urges the
13		continued meaningful implementation of the Consultant Order and Presidential
14		Memorandum by the next presidential administration.
15	BE IT FURTH	ER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes and
16		directs the Nation's delegation to the National Congress of American Indians'
17		2016 Mid-Year Conference and Marketplace to submit this resolution to NCAI for
18		its approval.
19	BE IT FINALI	Y RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it authorizes and
20		directs the Nation's Chairman or official designee to advocate the Nation's
21		positions expressed in this resolution to appropriate federal departments,
