1	Williams,	the constitution of the ronord o durant nation vests the registative council with
2		the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3		education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4		and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation and
6		all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the benefit of the Tohono
7		O'odham Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and
8	WHEREAS,	severely inadequate U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") funding for road
9		maintenance and repair is a persistent issue affecting the Tohono O'odham
10		Nation and its members, as well as U.S. Customs and Border Protection ("CBP"),
۱1		which frequently uses the Nation's roads for law enforcement, border security,
12		and emergency search and rescue purposes; and
13	WHEREAS,	for several years, the Nation has urged and facilitated discussions between BIA
۱4		and CBP to develop a memorandum of agreement to authorize transfer of funds
15		from CBP to BIA for road maintenance and repair of BIA roads heavily used by
16		CBP, such as BIA Route 21, which leads to the Papago Farms Law Enforcement
17		Center; and
18	WHEREAS,	while CBP is willing to provide much needed road repair and maintenance
19		funding, CBP also needs a clarification of legal authorities prior to executing a
20		memorandum of agreement with BIA; and
21	WHEREAS,	the Domestic Affairs, Agricultural and Natural Resources, and Appropriations
22		Committees reviewed and recommend support of federal legislation language,
23		which is incorporated by this reference, that authorizes the CBP to enter into an
24		agreement with and to transfer funds to the Director of the Bureau of Indian
25		Affairs to maintain or repair roads under the jurisdiction of the Director.
26	NOW, THERI	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports
27		federal legislation language, in substantially the form attached, that authorizes
28		U.S. Customs and Border Protection to enter into an agreement with and to
29		transfer funds to the Director of the U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs to maintain or
30		repair roads under the jurisdiction of the Director.
