RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Approving the Installation of a Shade Canopy by the United States Customs and Border Protection for Checkpoint Station on BIA Indian Reservation Road 15)

RESOLUTION NO. 16-395

1 WHEREAS, Article XVI, Section 1, of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation (the 2 "Nation") provides that the unallotted lands of the Nation "shall be held as 3 national lands forever" and are under the control and management of the 4 Legislative Council; and 5 WHEREAS, the Legislative Council has a duty "to manage, protect, preserve and regulate the 6 use of the property, wildlife, land, air and natural resources (including surface 7 and ground waters) of the Tohono O'odham Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, 8 Section 1(i)(2)); and 9 WHEREAS, the Nation has approved the issuance of a right-of-way to the Bureau of Indian 10 Affairs (BIA) for Indian Reservation Road (IRR) 15, which includes that portion of 11 Route 15 that passes through national lands within the Sif Oidak District; and 12 WHEREAS, the United States Customs and Border Protection (CBP) has received prior 13 approval from the Nation through Legislative Council Resolution No. 10-388 to 14 establish a tactical checkpoint station located on the BIA IRR 15 and IRR 42, 15 specifically at mile marker 30, which included the approval for the BIA 16 Transportation Division to issue an Encroachment Permit to CBP for a five-year 17 period; and 18 WHEREAS, upon approval by the Nation, the BIA's Transportation Division issued 19 Encroachment Permit No. 2010-0016 for the establishment of CBP's checkpoint 20 station for a five-year period which was extended for a second five-year period 21 through Legislative Council Resolution No. 15-324; and 22 WHEREAS. in accordance with the terms and conditions described in Tohono O'odham 23 Legislative Council Resolution No. 15-324, Resolution No. 08-399, and Resolution 24 No. 07-679 CBP must request and receive authorization from the Legislative 25 Council prior to installing buildings or otherwise establishing IRR 15 tactical 26 checkpoint infrastructure that is not readily removable, including but not 27 limited to telephone, electricity and other utility delivery systems; and 28 WHEREAS. CBP has proposed to construct a canopy as a means to improve the work 29 environment and safety for agents at the IRR 15 checkpoint station, and which

8 WHEREAS, CBP has provided sufficient documentation for the p	roject that includes canopy
9 specifications, site map, cultural and biological clear	ances; and
10 WHEREAS, Sif Oidak District and Gu Achi District were consul	lted by CBP on the canopy
11 proposal and adopted resolutions supporting the ins	tallation; and
12 WHEREAS, the Domestic Affairs and the Agricultural and Natu	ral Resources Committees
13 have reviewed the canopy proposal and recommend	approval by the Legislative
14 Council.	
15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Le	gislative Council approves
16 installation of the CBP shade canopy to be construe	cted at the CBP checkpoint
17 station located within the road right-of-way for IRR 1	5 at mile marker 30, which
18 shall be made a part of the current BIA Encroachn	nent Permit No. 2010-0016;
19 provided that the Nation reserves the right to revol	ke approval by subsequent
20 resolution, and further provided that the CBP person	nel shall:
21 (1) consult and coordinate with the Nation's De	epartment of Public Safety
22 (TODPS) to the maximum extent possible,	and work with a liaison
23 appointed by the TODPS Director to provid	le public information and
24 address concerns; and	
25 (2) respect the human and civil rights of the Nation	on's members and respond
26 in a timely manner to concerns regarding thes	e issues; and
27 (3) minimize any environmental impacts of	CBP operations by not
28 destroying vegetation , littering, or otherwise	injuring the Nation's lands,
29 including by not widening, or otherwise expan	ding existing roads without
30 the advance, written consent of the Legislative	Council; and

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1	(4)	consult with the Nation's Cultural Affairs Office to prevent damage to
2		cultural sites and with districts and communities to prevent any
3	i	interruption of traditional ceremonies or celebrations and to
4		immediately notify the Cultural Affairs Office upon gaining knowledge of
5		any such damage that might occur; and
6	(5)	refrain from harassing the Tohono O'odham and comply with all
7		applicable federal laws, including but not limited to those governing
8		searches, seizures, vehicle and other stops; and
9	(6)	with Legislative Council approval, consider improving existing roads
10		serving the Nation's members and its communities as a means of
11	i	improving community relations, lawful transportation,
12		communications, and access; and
13	(7)	remove vehicles abandoned by smugglers and drug traffickers but
14	1	refrain from destroying or unnecessarily damaging such vehicles, which
15		are often stolen from the Nation's members or other innocent victims;
16		and
17	(8)	request and receive authorization from the Legislative Council prior to
18		installing buildings or otherwise establishing Route 15 tactical
19		checkpoint infrastructure that is not readily removable, including but
20		not limited to telephone, electricity and other utility delivery systems;
21		and
22	(9)	report on IRR 15 checkpoint operations on a regular basis as requested
23		by the Nation's Chairperson or the Legislative Chairperson, and on a
24	:	monthly basis to the Domestic Affairs Committee and the Sif Oidak
25		District Council; and
26	(10)	generate and present a written annual report on IRR 15 checkpoint
27		operations to the Legislative Council.
28	BE IT FURTHER RESO	DLVED by the Legislative Council that CBP shall not install any temporary
29	or peri	nanent infrastructure or technology, or otherwise disturb any Nation's
30	lands o	outside the area covered by the Encroachment Permit without Legislative
31	Counci	l approval.
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The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 05TH day of <u>AUGUST</u>, 2016 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,021.4 FOR; -0-AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(i)(2) and Article XVI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
