RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Approving the Bureau of Indian Affairs to Conduct Road Repairs of Specific Roads on the Tohono O'odham Nation Using Funding Transferred from the United States Department of Homeland Security Customs and Border Protection)

RESOLUTION NO. 20-422

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") provides that the
2		unallotted lands of the Nation "shall be held as national lands forever" and are
3		under the control and management of the Legislative Council (Constitution,
4		Article XVI, Section 1); and
5	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation also vests the Legislative Council
6		with the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace,
7		morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its
8		members" and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on
9		behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments
10		or their departments, agencies, or political subdivisions (Constitution,
11		Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
12	WHEREAS,	the United States Congress by H.R. 1865-166 appropriated \$15,000,000.00 to
13		Customs and Border Protection/United States Border Patrol ("CBP/USBP") to
14		transfer to the Bureau of Indian Affairs "to supplement any other funding
15		available for reconstruction or repair of roads owned by the Bureau of Indian
16		Affairs "; and
17	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 19-342, the Legislative Council approved the FY 2020 Planning
18		and Economic Development Department Roads Program Project PIR 21(4) Santa
19		Cruz to Papago Farms Budget, which expended a large portion of the
20		\$15,000,000.00 appropriation; and
21	WHEREAS,	the Nation and CBP identified nine road maintenance and improvement
22		projects, which are listed in the "CBP Priority List" and incorporated by this
23		reference (hereafter referred to as, "CBP Roads Priority List"), and provided the
24		CBP Roads Priority List to the Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA"); and
25	WHEREAS,	the designated roads described in attachments "A" Graph depicting roads to be
26		maintained and repaired, "B" Road map of the overall project, "C" Inter-Agency
27		Agreement, and "D" Chairman Norris' letter of support to the BIA; and
28	WHEREAS,	improving the roads identified on the CBP Roads Priority List would improve
29		USBP patrol efforts on the Nation and directly benefit the Tohono O'odham
30		Nation and its members, the Nation's communities, and the environment; and

1	WHEREAS,	the roads on the CBP Roads Priority List are primarily used by the Tohono
2		O'odham, who would benefit from road improvements as some of these roads
3	1	have deteriorated over time and may have become impassable; and
4	WHEREAS,	USBP and the BIA have entered into an Inter-Agency Agreement, with the consent
5		of the Tohono O'odham Nation, to utilize the remaining \$5,000,000.00 for
6		additional road repairs after the completion of Federal Route 21; and
7	WHEREAS,	the dirt roads described are in dire need of repair due to lack of maintenance and
8		repair, along with moon dust pits eroding the roadway and not allowing vehicles
9		to drive the road in a safe manner; and
10	WHEREAS,	the Nation's Planning and Economic Development Department Roads Program,
11		in collaboration with the USBP Liaisons, have presented and obtained supporting
12		resolutions from the Pisinemo, Chukut Kuk, Gu Vo, and Sells District (Pisinemo
13		District Council Resolution 21-P-03, Chukut Kuk District Resolution No. 2020-33,
14		Gu Vo District Resolution GV-20-065, Sells District Resolution SD-130-20); and
15	WHEREAS,	USBP Liaisons and the Nation's Planning and Economic Development
16		Department Roads Program will provide the affected districts with a schedule
17		once a contractor is selected and a notice to proceed is provided by the BIA; and
18	WHEREAS,	the Domestic Affairs, Budget and Finance, and Agricultural and Natural
19		Resources Committees have reviewed and recommend approval of the
20		resolution.
21	NOW, THERE	ORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislative Council approves the BIA to conduct road
22		repairs for the roads listed in the CBP Roads Priority List using the funding
23		transferred from the Department of Homeland Security Customs and Border
24		Protection, provided that:
25		(1) The Nation's Planning and Economic Development Department and BIA
26		shall provide notice to the Nation's Realty Office, Environmental
27		Protection Office, Wildlife and Vegetation Management Program, and the
28		Pisinemo, Chukut Kuk, Gu Vo, and Sells Districts before commencing
29		repairs, maintenance, and improvements.
30		(2) All work is conducted in accordance with applicable federal and Nation's
31		laws, including environmental and cultural protections.
32		(3) The Nation's Tribal Historic Preservation Office ("THPO") shall review the
33		CBP Roads Priority List and identify cultural resource sites significant to
34		the Nation prior to any work commencing and BIA contractors shall take

all necessary precautions to prevent any harm or damage to the identified sites. (4) The Nation's Planning and Economic Department and BIA shall coordinate with the Wildlife and Vegetation Management Program when maintenance, repair work, or improvements are being done in critical habits for threatened or endangered species to avoid disturbance to those species during breeding season. The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the $08^{ ext{TH}}$ day of DECEMBER, 2020 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3.175.7 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(c)(2), Article VI, Section 1(f), Article XVI, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
