10	WHEREAS,	HCM 2003 urges the United States Department of the Interior ("DOI") to					
11		investigate all 51 of the former and current Indian boarding schools located in					
12		Arizona, and that the DOI use, or designate the use of, ground penetrating radar					
13		to look for unmarked graves and return of any discovered remains to their					
14		families or tribes, as requested, for appropriate repatriation and burial; and					
15	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 22-073, the Tohono O'odham Nation supported the Department					
16		of the Interior Federal Indian Boarding School Initiative; and					
17	WHEREAS,	the Human Resources Development and Appropriations Committees					
18		recommend supporting Arizona HCM 2003 or similar state legislation.
