## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Opposing Arizona House and Senate Elections Bills)

## **RESOLUTION NO. 22-115**

1	WHEREAS,	"All political power is inherent in the people" (Constitution, Article III, Section
2		1); and
3	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation also vests the Legislative Council
4		with the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace,
5		morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its
6		members" and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on
7		behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments
8		on all matters within the authority of the Tohono O'odham Council."
9		(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
10	WHEREAS,	the Arizona State Legislature introduced several bills, HB 2236 -Voter
11		Registration; Request Required, HB 2237 - Same Day Voter Registration;
12		Prohibition, HB 2238 - Ballot Drop Boxes; Prohibition, HB 2786 - Voter
13		Registration Requests, SB 1058 - Drive Up Voting; Prohibition, SB 1404 -
14		Eligibility; Early Voting, that create additional barriers for voters to vote by mail
15		or to register to vote; and
16	WHEREAS,	HB 2236 prohibits a state or a political subdivision of the state from registering a
17		person to vote unless that person requested to register; and
18	WHEREAS,	HB 2237 prohibits a state or a political subdivision of the state from registering a
19		person to vote on election day; and
20	WHEREAS,	HB 2238 prohibits a county recorder or other officer in charge of elections from
21		using an unmonitored drop box for receipt of voted early ballots; and
22	WHEREAS,	HB 2786 limits the distribution of early ballot request forms to only a political
23		party, county recorder, or election official; and
24	WHEREAS,	SB 1058 prohibits a county recorder or officer in charge of elections from allowing
25		a voter to receive a ballot and vote from a vehicle and from using a ballot drop box
26		except inside a polling place or voting center; and
27	WHEREAS,	SB 1404 imposes eligibility restrictions for voters requesting to vote early by mail
28		to voters physically unable to go to the polls, voters 65 years of age or older, voters
29		whose residence is more than 15 miles from the polling place, voters unable to
30		attend the polls on election day because of religious reasons, and other eligibility
31		restrictions; and

HB 2237 - Same Day Voter Registration; Prohibition; 13 3. HB 2238 - Ballot Drop Boxes; Prohibition; 14 4. HB 2786 - Voter Registration Requests; 15 5.
