RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting the Tribal Medical Supplies Stockpile Access Act of 2022)

RESOLUTION NO. 22-202

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3		education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4		and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation and
6		all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the benefit of the Tohono
7		O'odham Nation and all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the
8		benefit of the Tohono O'odham Nation "(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)
9		and Section 1(j)); and
10	WHEREAS,	the Tribal Medical Supplies Stockpile Access Act of 2022, which was introduced in
11		the House of Representatives by Congressman Ruben Gallego with H.R. 6372 and
12		in the Senate by Senator Elizabeth Warren with S. 3444, would require the
13		Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") to deploy drugs, vaccines,
14		biological products, medical devices, and other supplies from the Strategic
15		National Stockpile directly to health programs or facilities operated by the Indian
16		Health Service ("IHS"), tribes, or tribal organizations; and
17	WHEREAS,	such supplies from the Strategic National Stockpile would be used to respond to
18		public health emergencies; and
19	WHEREAS,	if the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services distributes pandemic or
20		epidemic products (e.g., drugs or medical devices) to states or other entities, the
21		U.S. Department of Health and Human Services must also deploy such products
22		directly to health programs or facilities operated by IHS or other tribal entities;
23		and
24	WHEREAS,	pursuant to the legislation, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
25		must coordinate with states, programs, and facilities to ensure supplies and
26		products are distributed to such tribal entities; and
27	WHEREAS,	in the Nation's best interests, the Appropriations and Health and Human Services
28		Committees recommend supporting H.R. 6372 and S. 3444, the Tribal Medical
29		Supplies Stockpile Access Act of 2022, or similar federal legislation.
30	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council strongly
31		supports H.R. 6372 and S. 3444, the Tribal Medical Supplies Stockpile Access Act
32		of 2022, or similar federal legislation, and urges the United States Congress to
33		pass the legislation.
