1	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council is vested with the authority to enact ordinances "to
2		promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education and
3		general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members" and the power
4		"to provide for, appoint, or provide for the appointment of, and prescribe the
5		duties and powers of committees, boards, officers and agents" (Constitution of
6		the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and 1(b)); and
7	WHEREAS,	in 1985 the Papago Council enacted the Papago Employment Rights Ordinance
8		("TERO Ordinance"), thereby establishing the Papago Employment Rights
9		Commission, since renamed as the Tribal Employment Rights Commission (the
0		"TERO Commission") and vesting the Council with the power to select, appoint,
11		and remove TERO Commissioners by resolution (13 Tohono O'odham Code,
12		Chapter 1 Tribal Employment Rights); and
13	WHEREAS,	in 2012, the Nation suspended the TERO Commissioners by Resolution No. 12- 384
14		"Suspending TERO Commissioners" and ultimately removed the TERO
15		Commissioners by Resolution No. 14-060 "Removing TERO Commissioners"; and
16	WHEREAS,	in 2013 when the TERO Commissioners were suspended, but had not yet been
17		removed, interim TERO Commissioners were appointed to serve until successors
18		could be appointed so that the Commission could conduct business, ensure that
19		Indian preference was enforced, and provide necessary services for the Nation's
20		members (Resolution No. 13-093, No. 13-094, No. 13-095, No. 13-096); and
21	WHEREAS,	in 2016, because all interim Commissioners had resigned, Representatives
22		Chester Antone, Louis R. Lopez, Daniel L.A. Preston, III, Sandra Ortega, and
23		Barbara Havier were appointed as interim TERO Commissioners for a term of six
24		months and the term of each interim Commissioner was subsequently extended
25		until a successor was appointed (Resolution No. 16-063 and Resolution No. 16-
26		412); and
27	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 17-019, the Legislative Council approved the appointment of
28		Delma M. Garcia to the TERO Commission to replace Representative Barbara
29		Havier; and
