1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Tohono O'odham	
2		Legislative Council with the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public	
3		health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham	
4		Nation and its members" and to "consult with the Congress of the United States	
5		and appropriate federal agencies regarding federal activities that affect the	
6		Tohono O'odham Nation and all federal appropriation estimates and projects for	
7		the benefit of the Tohono O'odham Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, Section	
8	9	1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and	
9	WHEREAS,	written comments by the Tohono O'odham Nation that take a position supporting	
10		or opposing a federal, state, or local government action require approval from	
11		the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council (1 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3,	
12		Section 3103(C)); and	
13	WHEREAS,	Section 3105 of 1 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 provides that if there is "not	
14		sufficient time to obtain Legislative Council approval the Chairperson shall	
15		obtain the concurrence of the Legislative Council committee with primary	
16		oversight over the subject matter of the comments before submitting them." (1	
17		Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3, Section 3105); and	
18	WHEREAS,	the Bristol Bay watershed in Southwest Alaska is an area of unparalleled	
19		ecological and economic value, boasting salmon diversity and productivity	
20		unrivaled anywhere in North America; and	
21	WHEREAS, the Bristol Bay watershed has supported a subsistence-based way of life that ha		
22		sustained the Yup'ik, Dena'ina, and Alutiiq people of Southwest Alaska since time	
23		immemorial; and	
24	WHEREAS,	the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") has authority under Section	
25		404(c) of the Clean Water Act ("CWA"), and its implementing regulations at 40	
26		C.F.R. Part 241, to prohibit, restrict, or deny the discharge of dredged or fill	
27		material at defined sites in waters of the United States (including wetlands)	
28		whenever it determines, after notice and opportunity for public hearing, that use	
29		of such sites for disposal would have unacceptable adverse impact on one or	
30		more of various resources, including fisheries, wildlife, municipal water	
31		supplies, or recreational areas; and

1 WHEREAS, on May 26, 2022, EPA Region 10 published a CWA Section 404(c) Proposed 2 Determination ("2022 Proposed Determination") to prohibit and restrict the use 3 of certain waters in the Bristol Bay watershed as disposal sites for the discharge 4 of dredged or fill material associated with mining the Pebble deposit, a large ore 5 body in Southwest Alaska; and 6 WHEREAS, on June 24, 2022, EPA Region 10 issued a Federal Register notice extending the 7 public comment period through September 6, 2022, to provide sufficient time for 8 the public to meaningfully comment on the 2022 Proposed Determination; and 9 WHEREAS. the United Tribes of Bristol Bay ("UTBB") is a tribal consortium, consisting of 15 10 federally recognized tribes in Bristol Bay, working to protect the traditional 11 Yup'ik, Dena'ina, and Alutiiq ways of life in Southwest Alaska that depend on the 12 pristine Bristol Bay watershed and all it sustains, most notably Bristol Bay's wild 13 salmon; and 14 WHEREAS, at the request of the UTBB, Chairman Norris submitted a letter to EPA Region 10 15 during the public comment period in support of permanent protections of the 16 Bristol Bay watershed, after determining there was insufficient time for Tohono 17 O'odham Legislative Council approval and with the concurrence of the Water 18 Resources Committee; and 19 the Water Resource Committee also recommends supporting the UTBB and EPA WHEREAS, 20 Region 10's 2022 Proposed Determination by resolution. 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council: 22 **(1)** recognizes the need to secure permanent protections for the Bristol Bay 23 watershed's rivers, streams and wetlands that support the world's largest 24 sockeye salmon fishery and a subsistence-based way of life that has 25 sustained the Yup'ik, Dena'ina, and Alutiiq people of Southwest Alaska 26 since time immemorial; and

(2) supports EPA Region 10's 2022 Proposed Determination to prohibit and restrict the use of certain waters in the Bristol Bay watershed as disposal sites for the discharge of dredged or fill material associated with mining the Pebble deposit.
