RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Declaring Interest in Participation in the State of Arizona Governor's Water Policy Council and Appointing the Nation's Chairperson)

RESOLUTION NO. 23-028

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides that "[a]ll waters which
2		originate in or flow in, into or through the Tohono O'odham Nation, or which are
3		stored in the Tohono O'odham Nation, whether found on the surface or
4		underground, are a valuable public resource of the Tohono O'odham Nation to be
5		protected for the present and future use of the Tohono O'odham Nation as a
6		whole" (Constitution, Article XVII, Section 1); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Constitution vests the Legislative Council with the power to "consult,
8		negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of the Tohono
9		O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments and other Indian
10		tribes or their departments, agencies, or political subdivisions, or with private
11		persons or organizations on all matters within the authority of the Tohono
12		O'odham Council" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(f)); and
13	WHEREAS,	the Constitution authorizes the Legislative Council to "provide for, appoint, or
14		provide for the appointment of, and prescribe the duties and powers of
15		committees, board, officers and agents" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(b));
16		and
17	WHEREAS,	under the Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Act, Pub. L. 97-293 (1982)
18		(SAWRSA), as amended by the Arizona Water Settlements Act, Pub. L. 108-451
19		(2004) (AWSA), the Nation gave up its significant claims concerning damages to
20		groundwater and surface water on the Nation's reservation lands in the Tucson
21		Active Management Area, in return for reliable, affordable, and long-term access
22		to Central Arizona Project (CAP) water, as well as on-reservation groundwater
23		protections; and
24	WHEREAS,	while SAWRSA settled the Nation's water rights claims to a little over 100,000
25		acres, the vast majority of the Nation's federal reserved water rights underlying
26		its two million acre reservation, both within and outside of current Active
27		Management Areas, remain unquantified, and are the subject of ongoing
28		settlement negotiations with the United States and others; and
29	WHEREAS,	historic drought conditions and chronic over-allocation of Colorado River water
30		have resulted in diminished availability of CAP and surface water from other
31		sources in Arizona, and has increased demand for groundwater in ways that have
32		and will significantly impact the Nation and its water resources; and

(Declaring Interest in Participation in the State of Arizona Governor's Water Policy Council and Appointing the Nation's Chairperson) Page 2 of 3 1 WHEREAS. on January 9, 2023, the Governor of the State of Arizona, in recognition of these 2 conditions, created the Governor's Water Policy Council to analyze and 3 recommend updates to the 1980 Arizona Groundwater Management Act; and 4 WHEREAS. among other stakeholders, the Governor has solicited membership on the 5 Governor's Water Policy Council from Tribes both within and outside current 6 Active Management Areas, as recommended by the Inter Tribal Council of 7 Arizona: and 8 WHEREAS. it is in the Nation's interest to participate in the Governor's Water Policy Council. 9 and the Water Resources Committee recommends that the Nation (1) notify the 10 Inter Tribal Council and the Governor, as appropriate, of its interest in such 11 participation, and (2) if selected to participate, appoint the Nation's chairperson 12 to represent the Nation's interests through membership on the Governor's Water 13 **Policy Council.** 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it declares 15 its interest in participation on the Governor's Water Policy Council. 16 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council appoints the Nation's 17 chairperson to represent the Nation's interests on the Governor's Water Policy 18 Council, and authorizes the Nation's chairperson and the Water Resources 19 Committee to take all necessary actions to carry out the intent of this resolution. 20 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the ${f 13}^{
