1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with

4		and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of
5		the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments"
6	<u> </u>	(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
7	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation has established positions in support of and in
8		opposition to proposed education state legislation (e.g., Resolution No. 22-112
9		"Supporting Arizona Senate Bill 1300 Tribal College Dual Enrollment Program");
10		and
11	WHEREAS,	in order to effectively advocate for state education legislation that benefits the
12		Nation and its members and to oppose state legislation that may limit access to,
13		or cut funding for, important education services, the Appropriations and Human
14		Resources Development Committees recommend affirming the Nation's
15		education state legislation positions.
16	NOW, THERE	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council affirms the
17		Tohono O'odham Nation's prior positions on the substance of education state
18		legislation positions and continues to support legislation that:
19		(1) increases education funding;
20		(2) ensures educators serving tribal communities receive salary increases
21	li.	commensurate with other educators;
22		(3) increases funding for tribal community colleges such as the Tohono
23		O'odham Community College;
24		(4) invests in high-speed internet and transportation infrastructure; and
25		(5) expands early childhood education funding.
26	BE IT FINALLY	RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council opposes state education
27		legislation that limits funding or access to education services and resources.
