RESOLUTION NO. 23-035

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3		education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4		and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts on behalf of
5		the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local governments"
6		(Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(f)); and
7	WHEREAS,	in 2019, by Resolution No. 19-064, the Legislative Council supported Arizona
8		House Bill 2570 for the establishment of a study committee on missing and
9		murdered indigenous women and girls; and
10	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 19-345, the Legislative Council nominated Tohono O'odham
11		Police Chief Elton Begay to the Study Committee on Missing and Murdered
12		Indigenous Women and Girls; and
13	WHEREAS,	after approval and enactment of House Bill 2570 by the Arizona State Legislature
14		and Governor Doug Ducey, the Study Committee on Missing and Murdered
15		Indigenous Women and Girls ("Study Committee") conducted a comprehensive
16		study to determine how the State of Arizona could reduce and end violence
17		against indigenous women and girls, established methods for tracking and
18		collecting data, including data on missing and murdered indigenous women and
19		girls, and proposed measures in a report on the Study Committee's activities and
20		recommendations; and
21	WHEREAS,	by Resolution Nos. 21-059 and 21-060, the Legislative Council supported House
22		Bill 2098 Missing Children; Mandatory Reporting and House Bill 2100 Missing;
23		Unidentified Person; Reporting Requirements, which were recommendations
24		included in the Study Committee's report; and
25	WHEREAS,	in order to effectively advocate for the recommendations from the Missing and
26		Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls Study Committee report, the
27		Appropriations, Health and Human Services, and Domestic Affairs Committees
28		recommend affirming the Nation's positions that support state legislation
29		implementing the Study Committee's recommendations.
30	NOW, THERI	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council affirms
31		Resolution Nos. 19-064, 19-345, 21-059 and 21-060 and its prior positions on the
32		substance of the Tohono O'odham Nation's missing and murdered indigenous
