## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Approving the Memorandum of Agreement with the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc. and Granting a Limited Waiver of the Nation's Sovereign Immunity)

## RESOLUTION NO. 23-110

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") vests the Legislative
2		Council with the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health,
3		peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and
4		its members" and to "consult, negotiate and conclude agreements and contracts
5		on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and local
6		governments and other Indian tribes or their departments, agencies, or political
7		subdivisions, or with private persons or organizations" (Constitution, Article VI,
8		Section I (c)(2) and l(f)); and
9	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation desires to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement
10		("Agreement") with the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona ("ITCA"), which has
11		received a funding award from the U.S. Department of Health and Human
12		Services, Administration for Community Living to conduct the Alzheimer's
13		Disease Program Initiative (90ADP10077-01-00, CFDA #93.761) for the period
14		September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024 ("Program"); and
15	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation desires to participate in the Program to (1) market
16		and coordinate the community-based education programs offered by ITCA-AAA
17		and Banner Alzheimer's Institute, (2) participate in the Powerful Tools for
18		Caregivers Program, (3) attend working group meetings to provide feedback on
19		project activity and sustainability, and (4) document non-personally identifiable
20		palticipant information for grant reporting, and (5) complete pre and post
21		evaluation for training; and
22	WHEREAS,	the ITCA is the primary contractor for the implementation of the Program and is
23		required to enter into agreements with each prulicipating Tribe to complete a
24		portion of the overall Program; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Nation wish to enter into this Agreement with the ITCA in which the Nation will
26		perform cellain services related to the Program in exchange for resources and
27		materials provided to the Tohono O'odham Nation; and
28	WHEREAS,	the Agreement requires the Nation to grant a limited waiver of sovereign
29		immunity to be able to enter into this Agreement; and
30	WHEREAS,	the Nation's Department of Senior Services requests a limited waiver of the
31		Nation's sovereign immunity under the following conditions: this limited waiver
32		shall (I) only be effective during the term of the Agreement; (2) be granted solely

(Approving the Memorandum of Agreement with the Inter-Tribal Council of Arizona, Inc. and RESOLUTION NO. 23-110 Granting a Limited Waiver of the Nation's Sovereign Immunity) Page 2 of 3 in favor of the ITCA and shall not be enforceable by any third party; (3) be 1 enforceable by ITCA for the sole purpose of enforcing this Agreement; (4) only be 2 available for injunctive and declaratory relief; and (5) be limited to breach of the 3 Agreement by the Nation; and 4 the Health and Human Services Committee has reviewed the Agreement, 5 WHEREAS, including the limited waiver of sovereign immunity, and recommends approval 6 of the Agreement and recommends the Nation grant the limited waiver of 7 sovereign immunity under the specific conditions contained herein. 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the 9 Memorandum of Agreement between the Nation and the ITCA, in substantially the 10 form attached. 11 BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves a limited 12 waiver of the Nation's sovereign immunity solely in favor of the ITCA under the 13 specific conditions described herein. 14 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Tohono O'odham 15 Nation chairperson or any designated official is authorized to execute the 16 Agreement with the ITCA in substantially the form attached, provided that any 17 amendments shall be submitted for prior approval by the Tohono O'odham 18 Legislative Council. 19 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the  $11^{
m TH}$ day of APRIL, 2023 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,939.75 FOR; 20 278.25 AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and -0- ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council 21 by, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)and 1(f) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted 22 by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy 23 Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the 24 25 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). 26 27 TQHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 28 29 30 31 32 mothy Joaquin, Legis 33 34 35 36 37
