## LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Judgment in Contest of April 29, 2023 Primary Election for the Offices of Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Nation)

## **LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 23-155**

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides that the "Council shall
2		enact an election ordinance which shall prescribe the qualifications of
3		candidates, the registration requirements for voting and such other rules and
4		procedures necessary to the orderly conduct of elections, including but not
5		limited to procedures for validation of petitions and the settlement of any and all
6		election disputes" (Constitution, Article X, Section 7); and
7	WHEREAS,	the "decision of the Tohono O'odham Council in all election matters, including
8		the eligibility and qualifications of candidates, shall be final" (Constitution,
9		Article X, Section 7); and
10	WHEREAS,	"a general election may be postponed for up to one month when such
11		postponement is necessary in the opinion of the Council" (12 T.O.C. Chapter 1 –
12		Elections, Section 1802); and
13	WHEREAS,	12 T.O.C. Chapter 1 – Elections, establishes the procedure for "[a]ny eligible voter
14		of the Nation" to contest an election upon specific grounds, including "[f]or
15		misconduct on the part of any district election board or of the [Election] Board, or
16		any member thereof" (12 T.O.C. Chapter 1 – Elections, Section 1901(A)); and
17	WHEREAS,	when "a contest statement is filed with the [Election] Board alleging misconduct
18		on the part of the Board or any member thereof," the Legislative Council has
19		jurisdiction to hear the contest (Elections, Section 1904); and
20	WHEREAS,	12 T.O.C. Chapter 1 – Elections, further provides that the Legislative Council "will
21		meet within 15 days after the receipt of the [Election Board's] answer for the sole
22		purpose of hearing the contest on the grounds of misconduct on the part of the
23		Board or any member thereof and shall decide the issue(s) raised in the contest
24		statement on those grounds only" (Elections, Section 1905(B)); and
25	WHEREAS,	on April 29, 2023, the Election Board conducted the Nation's 2023 primary
26		election, including the election for the offices of the chairperson and vice
27		chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Nation, and the Board posted its certificates
28		of election results on April 29, 2023; and
29	WHEREAS,	on May 3, 2023, the Election Board delivered to the Legislative Council secretary a
30		contest statement filed by Nation's voters Juan C. Buendia and Damascus D.
31		Francisco ("Buendia-Francisco contestors") alleging Election Board misconduct
32		during the Nation's 2023 primary election for the offices of chairperson and vice
33		chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Nation; and

1	WHEREAS,	on May 3, 2023, the Legislative Council secretary provided the Council's Election
2		Contest Hearing Procedures and written notice to the Election Board
3		("contestee") requiring the contestee to file an answer to the contest statement
4		with the secretary within five days of receipt, and the secretary copied the
5		Buendia-Francisco contestors (Elections, Section 1905(A)); and
6	WHEREAS,	on May 4 and May 5, 2023, the Election Board delivered to the Legislative Council
7		secretary additional contest statements filed by Nation's voters ("contestors")
8	İ	also alleging Election Board misconduct during the Nation's 2023 primary
9		election for the offices of chairperson and vice chairperson of the Tohono
10		O'odham Nation; and
11	WHEREAS,	on May 5, 2023, the Legislative Council secretary provided all the contestors
12		whose valid contest statements had been received to that point, and the contestee
13		with written notice of the contest hearing date, time, and location and with copies
14		of the Council's Election Contest Hearing Procedures; the secretary sent the same
15		notice and copies of the Election Contest Hearing Procedures to any remaining
16		contestors with copies to all other parties on May 8, 2023; and
17	WHEREAS,	on May 9, 2023, the Election Board filed with the Legislative Council secretary a
18		written answer to the contest statements; and
19	WHEREAS,	contestors Buendia-Francisco and the contestee each provided a list of hearing
20		evidence and witnesses, as well as copies of evidence, to the secretary and the
21		other parties before the contest hearing was scheduled to convene; and
22	WHEREAS,	the majority of the remaining contestors did not file lists of hearing evidence and
23		witnesses; and
24	WHEREAS,	during the Legislative Council's May 16, 2023 election contest hearing, contestors
25		Buendia-Francisco and the contestee Election Board were represented by legal
26		counsel, and the parties were given the opportunity to appear; testify; make
27		opening statements; to call, question, and cross-examine witnesses; present
28		evidence; make objections; make closing statements; and otherwise participate
29	YATYYED HAO	in the hearing; and
30	WHEREAS,	at the conclusion of the Legislative Council's election contest hearing, the
31		presiding officer ordered a vote to determine whether the primary election
32		results contested should be certified or set aside in accordance with 12 T.O.C.
33		Chapter 1.

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 23-155 (Judgment in Contest of April 29, 2023 Primary Election for the Offices of Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Nation) Page 3 of 3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the April 29, 2023 primary election results for the offices of chairperson and vice chairperson of the Tohono O'odham Nation are set aside. BE IT FURTHER ORDERED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that a special primary election for eligible and qualified sets of candidates for the offices of the Nation's chairperson and vice chairperson, as determined by the Election Board pursuant 12 T.O.C. Chapter 1, shall be conducted on June 24, 2023 and the Nation's 2023 general election is postponed and shall be conducted on July 22, 2023. BE IT FINALLY ORDERED that the Nation's Election Board is directed to issue and publicly publish a revised election schedule consistent with the special primary election and postponed general election dates set by this order. The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of MAY, 2023 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 194.45 CERTIFIED; 3,023.55 SET ASIDE; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article V. Section 1; Article VI, Section 1; Article VI, subsection 1(a), subsection 1(g), and subsection 1(l); and Article X, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
