RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Modifying the Effective Date of 13 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 – Whistleblower Protection, Sections 3101, 3104, 3105, and 3107)

RESOLUTION NO. 23-342

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation provides that "[t]he sovereign
2		powers, authority and jurisdiction of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its
3		government shall extend to all persons and activities carried on within the
4		boundaries of the Tohono O'odham Nation consistent with federal law"
5	İ	(Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article I, Section 2); and
6	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is vested with the power "to govern the
7		conduct of members of the Tohono O'odham Nation and other persons within its
8		jurisdiction;" "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
9	-	education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members;"
10		"to manage any funds within the exclusive control of the Tohono O'odham Nation,
11		including proceeds derived from lands and resources of the Tohono O'odham
12		Nation, and to appropriate these funds for the benefit of the nation and its
13		members;" "to authorize, charter and regulate public or private corporations
14		and associations;" and "to enact laws, ordinances and resolutions necessary or
15		incidental to the exercise of its legislative powers" (Constitution of the Tohono
16		O'odham Nation, Article VI, Section 1(c)(1) and (2), Section 1(d)(2), Section 1(e), and
17		Section 1(l)); and
18	WHEREAS,	it is critical that employees of the Nation, districts, and enterprises of the Nation
19		or districts are provided working environments where disclosures of
20		information intended to shield the Nation, districts, or enterprises from fraud,
21		theft, or other detrimental effects may be made without retaliation or fear of
22	,	retaliation; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council passed Resolution No. 23-225, which became effective
24		June 26, 2023, and enacted 13 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 - Whistleblower
25		Protection ("Whistleblower Protection law"), which provides procedures and
26		protections for employees of the Nation, districts, and enterprises of the Nation
27		or districts who submit statements disclosing evidence of misconduct;
28		establishes timeframes for investigating statements of misconduct; creates the
29		Office of Administrative Appeals as the Nation's administrative hearing body; and
30		provides remedies for claims of retaliation; and
31	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 23-225, the Whistleblower Protection law currently has a
32		delayed effective date of October 20, 2023; and

(Modifying the Effective Date of 13 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 - Whistleblower Protection, Sections 3101, 3104, 3105, and 3107) Page 2 of 3 1 WHEREAS. since the enactment of the Whistleblower Protection law, multiple 2 whistleblowers have disclosed allegations of misconduct; and 3 WHEREAS. in order to ensure that employees of the Nation, districts, and enterprises of the 4 Nation or districts can disclose evidence of misconduct without facing retaliation 5 or fear of retaliation, the Human Resources Development Committee 6 recommends that the retaliation protections provided under the Whistleblower 7 Protection law go into effect immediately. 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Tohono O'odham Legislative Council modifies the 9 effective date of 13 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 - Whistleblower Protection. 10 Sections 3101, 3104, 3105, and 3107 only to the effective date of this Resolution; 11 provided that the remainder of 13 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 3 shall be 12 effective October 20, 2023. 13 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the $11^{ ext{TH}}$ 14 day of <u>SEPTEMBER 2023</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>3,005.7</u> FOR; 15 -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 257.6 [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the 16 Council by, Article I, Section 2, Article VI, Section 1(c)(1), Section 1(c)(2), Section 1(d)(2), Section 17 1(e), and Section 1(l); Article IX, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, 18 adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy 19 Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the 20 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984). 21 22 TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 **ATTÉST** 32 33 34 Evonne Wilson, Legislative Secretary 35 36 37
