## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Transferring Sif Oidak District Financial Management Functions and Control of Funds to the Tohono O'odham Nation

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the fiscal powers to "prevent the use, disposition or encumbrance of fiscal assets
3		of the Tohono O'odham Nation," "manage any funds within the exclusive control
4		of the Tohono O'odham Nation and to appropriate these funds for the benefit
5		of the nation and its members" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(d)(1) and (d)(2));
6		and
7	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article IX, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham
8		Nation, "[n]o district council shall expend district funds except pursuant to
9		budgets authorized under resolutions of the district council and approved by the
10		Tohono O'odham Council"; and
11	WHEREAS,	the Gaming Ordinance, the Tohono O'odham Nation-State of Arizona Amended
12		and Restated Gaming Compact, and the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act require
13		the Nation to ensure that net gaming revenues, including revenues allocated to
14		districts, are used exclusively to fund government operations or programs or for
15		another of the specific purposes authorized by law (Gaming Ordinance, Section
16	;	302; Compact, Section 16(d); 25 U.S.C. Section 2710(b)(2)(B)); and
17	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council is vested with substantial control over the Nation's 11 local
18		district governments and over district finances; it may by ordinance change
19		district boundaries, create a district, or disestablish a district (Constitution,
20		Article IX, Section 2); and
21	WHEREAS,	the districts "are organizations of fairly limited power and authority which may
22		act only under the supervision of the Tohono O'odham Council" and which may
23		not expend district funds without a budget authorized by district council
24		resolution and approved by the Legislative Council (Juan v. Juan, 2 TOR3d 62
25		(Trial Ct., Jan. 27, 2000) appeal dism'd, 3 TOR3d 1 (Jan. 4, 2005); Constitution,
26		Article IX, Section 7); and
27	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Judicial Court has recognized that even after distributing
28		funds to a district, the Nation has an ongoing fiduciary obligation to ensure that
29		district funds are expended under valid authority (Angela Ortiz & Frances Ruiz v.
30		Charlene Montana, et al; consolidated with Tohono O'odham Nation v. Gu-Vo
31		Governing Council, 3 TOR3d 34 (Ct.App., Aug. 24, 2011)); and

RESOLUTION NO. 23-440 (Transferring Sif Oidak District Financial Management Functions and Control of Funds to the Tohono O'odham Nation) Page 2 of 7 1 WHEREAS. the Nation elects to allocate gaming, mining, leasing, and other revenues to fund 2 district government budgets, and the allocations of Nation's funds are the 3 primary sources of funding for Sif Oidak District operations; and 4 the Legislative Council established the Sif Oidak Development Authority ("SODA") WHEREAS. 5 as an entity of the Sif Oidak District by Nation's Ordinance No. 01-86, "Charter of 6 the Sif Oidak Development Authority" ("SODA Charter"); and 7 WHEREAS. in 2012, the Sif Oidak District Council approved District Resolution No. SODC 12-8 006 and requested that the Nation appropriate \$1.7 million, including \$1.2 9 million to purchase the 40-acre Bob's Market property and business north of the 10 Main Reservation (collectively, the "Property"); \$150,000 to refund the Sif Oidak 11 District for expenditures on a prior economic development feasibility study; and 12 \$350,000 to fund SODA operations, overhead, and improvements for SODA to 13 operate a business on the Property; and 14 WHEREAS, the Sif Oidak District Council supported its 2012 appropriation request by 15 submitting to the Legislative Council a "Sif Oidak District Funding Proposal," 16 which represented that the Property possessed a market value of \$8.25 million; 17 and 18 WHEREAS. while the Sif Oidak District Council supported a \$1.2 million purchase price, 19 following Legislative Council questions about the valuation's accuracy, "a 20 subsequent independent appraisal valued the Bob's Market store, property, 21 improvements, and value of the business as a going concern at \$295,249" 22 (Resolution No. 13-185); and 23 the Sif Oidak District Council then reaffirmed its request for the original \$1.7 WHEREAS. 24 million appropriation by District Resolution No. SODC 13-065; and 25 WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 13-185, the Legislative Council conditionally appropriated \$1.7 26 million for the Sif Oidak District and SODA as follows: 27 \$500,000 for the cost of purchasing 40 acres of property, the Bob's Market 28 L.L.C. store, improvements, and value of the business as a going concern; 29 \$150,000 to repay the Sif Oidak District for the Mile Post 21 project; \$75,000 30 for the SODA operating budget; \$675,000 for Bob's Market operations. 31 improvements, and contingency; and \$300,000 for a fuel site at Bob's Market 32 provided that the funds appropriated by this resolution . . . shall not be 33 loaned to any person or entity, or be used for any purpose other than those 34 expressly identified in this resolution.

2	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 13-185, the Legislative Council further amended the SODA
3	, , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , , ,	Charter to increase transparency and accountability by requiring (1) that the
4		"books and records of the Authority, including current financial and operating
5		statements and all budget information" be maintained at SODA's offices and be
6	1	available to Sif Oidak District officials and others; (2) that SODA's books and
7		records be "audited by an independent certified public accountant within 120
8		days of the close of each fiscal year" and (3) that, "[a] copy of the complete final
9		audit and a comprehensive, written annual report shall be provided to the Board,
10		District Council, Legislative Council, and Nation's chairperson; and the
11		accountant who prepared the audit shall present it to the Board and at a District
12		Council meeting that is open to District residents" (Resolution No. 13-185); and
13	WHEREAS,	the Sif Oidak District Council accepted the SODA Charter amendments by
14		Resolution No. SODC 13-066; and
15	WHEREAS,	SODA repeatedly violated Ordinance No. 86-01, Charter of the Sif Oidak
16		Development Authority, and Resolution No. 13-185 by failing to provide copies of
17		SODA's complete final audits or comprehensive, written annual reports to the
18	1	Legislative Council and Nation's chairperson for several years; and
19	WHEREAS,	despite Resolution No. 13-185's prohibition on expending Nation's funds "for any
20		purpose other than those expressly identified," the SODA Board chairman, who is
21		a Sif Oidak District Council representative, reported that the \$300,000
22		appropriated by Legislative Council Resolution No. 13-185 exclusively for a fuel
23		site on the Property had been reallocated for operating expenses; no fuel site was
24		ever constructed; and
25	WHEREAS,	the SODA Board chairman refused the request of a Nation's internal auditor to
26		provide financial records for a fraud investigation internal audit, which could
27		not be completed in the absence of adequate records; and
28	WHEREAS,	the Sif Oidak District Council has failed to manage SODA, ensure compliance with
29		the SODA Charter, provide oversight of the Nation's \$1.7 million appropriation, or
30		timely respond to numerous Nation's requests for financial information and
31		records critical to conducting a fraud investigation and subsequent fraud
32		accounting to evaluate, in part, if Nation's funds were lawfully expended
33		consistent with Resolution No. 13-185, the SODA Charter, and the Nation's laws;

(Transferring Sif Oidak District Financial Management Functions and Control of Funds to the Tohono O'odham Nation) Page 4 of 7 1 WHEREAS, the Nation has conditioned its annual allocation of Nation's gaming revenues to 2 districts on audits, controls, and other measures, including district "budgets 3 approved in accordance with Article VI, Section 1(d)(2) of the Nation's 4 Constitution and Section 302 of the Gaming Ordinance" (Section 1304(A) of 26 5 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1); and 6 the Sif-Oidak District FY 2024 Gaming Revenue Budget has not been approved by WHEREAS. 7 Legislative Council resolution as required under Article IX, Section 7 of the 8 Constitution: and 9 WHEREAS. by Resolution No. 23-385, the Legislative Council extended the District's authority 10 to expend existing funds within the Sif-Oidak District FY 2023 Gaming Revenue 11 Budget, as amended, to November 9, 2023; and 12 WHEREAS. the Budget and Finance and Commerce Committees recommend that the Nation 13 assume control of the Sif Oidak District's finances and accounts pending the 14 completion of financial and other investigations and a resolution, which may 15 include repayment, of the misappropriation or other unlawful expenditure the 16 Nation's funds; and 17 WHEREAS. the Sif-Oidak District Council has authorized by resolution its Sif-Oidak District 18 FY 2024 Gaming Revenue Budget, which is incorporated by this reference, in the 19 amount of \$5,609,719.09, which shall be funded by the Sif-Oidak District's (1) 20 August 2023 District Gaming Allocation in the amount of \$5,373,205.73, (2) Hia-21 Ced Gaming Allocation in the amount of \$126,260.07, and (3) Mining Allocation in 22 the amount of \$110,253.29; and 23 WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee reviewed the Sif-Oidak District FY 2024 24 Gaming Revenue Budget and recommends approval of the budget consistent with 25 the terms of this Resolution. 26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, in order to 27 continue funding Sif-Oidak District operations and services, approves the FY 28 2024 Sif Oidak District Gaming Revenue Budget, effective October 1, 2023, in the 29 amount of \$5,609,719.09, which shall be funded by the Sif Oidak District's (1) 30 August 2023 District Gaming Allocation in the amount of \$5,373,205.73, (2) Hia-31 Ced Gaming Allocation in the amount of \$126,260.07, and (3) Mining Allocation in 32 the amount of \$110,253.29; provided that the August 2023 District Allocation 33 apportioned for Sif Oidak District shall remain under the control and

33 34 management of the Nation in accordance with this Resolution and shall not be disbursed to the Sif Oidak District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:

- transfers to the Nation all financial management functions of the Sif Oidak District, control of all Sif Oidak District funds and accounts, and authority to expend the Sif Oidak District's funds in accordance with the FY 2024 Sif-Oidak District Gaming Revenue Budget, the FY 2021-2024 Sif-Oidak District American Rescue Plan Act Budget, and any other Legislative Councilapproved Sif Oidak District budgets, as amended or modified;
- rejects any limitations or conditions proposed by the Sif Oidak District Council for the transfer to the Nation of the District's financial management functions, control of all Sif Oidak District funds and accounts, and authority to expend the Sif Oidak District's funds pursuant to this Resolution;
- authorizes and directs the Nation's Accounting Office and Treasurer's Office to open any accounts necessary to manage the Sif Oidak District's finances and to provide technical assistance to the Sif Oidak District in order to comply with the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, all applicable laws, financial policies, and procedures; and
- 4. amends Resolution No. 23-324, "Approving FY 2021-2024 Sif-Oidak District American Rescue Plan Act Budget," and any other Legislative Council resolutions approving or amending Sif Oidak District budgets that are currently in effect, to transfer financial management and control over all Sif Oidak District budgets and accounts to the Nation pursuant to this Resolution.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes the Nation's chairperson, the Nation's attorney general, and any Nation's Executive Branch official or employee whom the Nation's chairperson designates in writing to communicate directly with the financial institutions at which the Sif Oidak District has financial accounts, including but not limited to operating and investment accounts, and to obtain control of such accounts as well as financial statements and records regarding such investments and operating accounts.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that, notwithstanding any Nation's law or resolution to the contrary, if the Sif Oidak District does not transfer control of the Sif Oidak District's funds and financial management

(Transferring Sif Oidak District Financial Management Functions and Control of Funds to the Tohono O'odham Nation) Page 6 of 7 1 functions to the Nation, no further distributions or allocations of gaming 2 revenue, mining royalties, or other funds shall be made available for expenditure 3 for the Sif Oidak District until the Nation's treasurer certifies in writing that 4 control of all Sif Oidak District funds has been transferred to the Nation. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the actions taken in 5 6 accordance with this Resolution shall be reported to the Budget and Finance 7 Committee monthly and upon the Committee's request, and shall be reported to 8 the Legislative Council in closed session quarterly. 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that nothing in this Resolution waives any civil or criminal liability of any person or entity, whether 10 11 or not currently established or identified or waives any obligation to produce 12 records and information. 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the November 2023 14 Amendments to Ordinance No. 86-01, Charter of the Sif Oidak Development 15 Authority, which are incorporated by this reference, are approved. BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that, notwithstanding any 16 17 Nation's law or resolution to the contrary, the provisions of this Resolution are 18 not severable and if any word, clause, phrase, or other provision (collectively, 19 "provision") of this Resolution or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, (1) this entire Resolution shall 20 21 be invalid, (2) the Legislative Council's approval of the FY 2024 Sif Oidak District 22 Gaming Revenue Budget shall be invalid, and (3) any authority to expend funds 23 under the FY 2024 Sif-Oidak District Gaming Revenue Budget shall be terminated. 24 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the  $08^{\mathrm{TH}}$ day of NOVEMBER 2023 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,263.3 FOR; 25 26 <u>-0-</u> AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article V, Section 1; Article VI, Section 1; Article VI, Section 1(d)(1), (d)(2), (d)(3), and (e); Article 27 28 VII, Section 2(c) and 2(d), Article IX, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy 29 30 Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the 31 Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984). 32 33 TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 34 35 36 37 egislative Chairwoman 38
