1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is authorized to "conclude agreements
2		and contracts on behalf of the Tohono O'odham Nation with Federal, State and
3		Local governments" (Tohono O'odham Nation Constitution, Article VI, Sec. 1(f));

5	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council shall "preserve and cultivate native arts,
6		crafts, and traditions" in accordance with established customs (Tohono O'odham
7	i	Nation Constitution, Article VI, Sec. 1(c)(2)); and
8	WHEREAS,	the Department of Natural Resources, Cultural Affairs Program seeks to renew
9		the 2018 Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") between the Tohono O'odham
10		Nation and Saguaro National Park, approved by Legislative Council via
11		Resolution No. 18-213 in June 2018, that authorized a simplified Special Use
12		Permit for Members of the Nation to harvest saguaro fruit and cholla buds in
13		Saguaro National Park; and
14	WHEREAS,	the proposed MOU will renew the expired agreement for five-years from the date
15		of signature and will modify the annual Special Use Permits provided by the
16		National Park Service to the Nation to allow for harvesting of prickly pear fruits
17		in addition to saguaro fruit and cholla buds in Saguaro National Park; and
18	WHEREAS,	the Saguaro National Park is within the boundaries of historic Papagueria; and
19	WHEREAS,	members of the Tohono O'odham Nation have gathered saguaro fruit and cholla
20		buds since time immemorial; and
21	WHEREAS,	the sacred importance of saguaro to the Tohono O'odham is also detailed in
22		Resolution 21-137, adopted by Legislative Council in May 2021; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council first acknowledged the importance of prickly pear to the
24		O'odham in January 1939 via Resolution No. 56; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Cultural Preservation and Agricultural and Natural Resources Committees
26		have reviewed the proposed renewed Memorandum of Understanding between
27		the Nation and Saguaro National Park and recommend its approval.
28	NOW, THERI	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the
29		renewed Memorandum of Understanding between the Tohono O'odham Nation
30		and Saguaro National Park.
