RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting Tohono O'odham Nation's FY 2026 Community Project Funding/ Congressionally Directed Spending Request for Western Police and Fire Substation Technology and Equipment)

RESOLUTION NO. 25-105

1	WHEREAS,	the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2		the authority "to promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3		education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4		and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal
5		agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation and
6		all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the benefit of the Tohono
7		O'odbam Nation" (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and
8	WHEREAS,	on March 15, 2021, the United States House of Representatives announced the
9		return of federal earmark requests, now called Community Project Funding
0		Requests in the U.S. House of Representatives and Congressionally Directed
1		Spending Requests in the U.S. Senate; and
2	WHEREAS,	by Resolution Nos. 22-145 and 23-094, the Legislative Council supported the
3		Tohono O'odham Nation's Police and Fire Western Substation Congressionally
4		Directed Funding Proposal for the FY 2023 and FY 2024 round of earmark
5		requests; and
6	WHEREAS,	the Nation's Police and Fire Western Substation Congressionally Directed
7		Funding Proposal were not selected and included in federal funding legislation
8		during FY 2023 and FY 2024; and
9	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 24-104, the Legislative Council supported the Nation's FY 2025
20		Police and Fire Western Substation Community Project Funding request and
21		appropriated 25%, \$125,000, in matching funds to support the Project, subject to
22		a federal funding appropriation; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department and Fire Department
24		headquarters are located 40 miles east of the western part of the reservation,
25		which creates significant challenges for timely emergency response to the
26		Nation's western communities; and
27	WHEREAS,	the goal of establishing a Western Police and Fire Substation, as a permanent
28		base of operations and emergency operations center, is to improve emergency
29		response times and support direct "first responder" services to the Nation's
30		western districts; and

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- WHEREAS, Congress appropriated \$1 million in federal funding for the FY 2024 Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending for the Nation's Western Police and Fire Substation project and the Nation appropriates \$250,000 in matching funds in accordance with Resolution No. 23-094; and
- WHEREAS, the Nation's FY 2025 Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending request will include a request for \$375,000 for technology and related equipment, and will commit to a 25% match (\$125,000) of the total technology and equipment costs (\$500,000) that will enhance the operation and response capabilities of the Western Police and Fire Substation; and
- WHEREAS, Chairman Verlon Jose and Appropriations Committees reviewed the Nation's FY 2026 Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending request for technology and equipment for the Western Police and Fire Substation and recommend supporting the proposal, including the 25% match of \$125,000, subject to a federal funding appropriation in the amount of \$375,000 by the United States Congress.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council:

- (1) supports the Nation's FY 2026 Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending request for \$375,000 for technology and equipment for the Western Police and Fire Substation to be submitted to the Nation's federal delegation, with a required 25% match of the total technology and equipment costs (\$500,000); and
- (2) approves a 25% match of \$125,000 from the Nation as appropriated in Resolution No. 23-094, subject to a federal funding appropriation in the amount of \$375,000 by the United States Congress.

The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 11TH day of APRIL 2025 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,998.3 FOR; 1,265.0 AGAINST; [01] NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section l(c)(2), and Section 1(j) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
