LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 25-182

1	WHEREAS,	Article VI, Section 1(g) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the
2		Legislative Council with authority "[t]o enact laws and ordinances for conducting
3		and regulating elections"; and
4	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has enacted 12 Tohono O'odham Code Chapter 1 -
5		Elections to regulate election matters, including the conduct of referendum and
6		initiative elections (12 T.O.C. Chapter 1 - Elections); and
7	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article XIV of the Constitution, the Legislative Council shall, "either
8		at the direction of the Council itself, or upon receipt of a petition signed by not
9		less than three hundred registered voters of the Tohono O'odham Nation, submit
0		any enacted or proposed ordinance, resolution or other national legislation to a
1		referendum of the registered voters"; and
2	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article XIII of 12 T.O.C. Chapter 1, the Election Board has certified
3		that REF-01-25, "Tohono O'odham Code, Title 12, Chapter 1 - Elections"
4		("Referendum") has received a minimum of three hundred valid signatures; and
5	WHEREAS,	based upon the Election Board's certification, the Legislative Council by
6		Legislative Order No. 25-156 has called a special election for August 16, 2025 to
7		allow the Nation's voters to consider the Referendum; and
8	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Section 11311(B) of the Elections law,
9		"Not later than 45 days preceding the election, the Council, after providing
20		reasonable opportunity for comments by all representatives, shall prepare
21		and file with the [Election] Board an analysis of the provisions of each ballot
22		proposal of a measure together with a list of popular arguments favoring
23		and opposing such proposal or measure. Each argument shall not exceed
24		300 words in length."

26	WHEREAS,	Legislative Council representatives were given a reasonable opportunity to
27		submit such comments; and
28	WHEREAS,	the Rules Committee bas developed the attached analysis of and compiled
29		arguments favoring and opposing the Referendum as the "Tohono O'odham
30		Code, Title 12, Chapter 1 - Elections Referendum' Analysis of Referendum' as
31		dated for reference June 20, 2025, which is incorporated by this reference.

BE IT FINALLY ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council's action in filing the analysis and arguments is mandated by Section 11311(B) of the Elections law and does not represent the Council's support for or opposition to the Referendum. The foregoing Order was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 27th day of IUNE. 2025 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,321.1 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Article VI, Section 1(g), Article X, and Article XIV of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
