1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is vested with the power "[t]o consult,

5		O'odham Council"; "[t]o exercise the inherent powers of the Tohono O'odham

14	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") adopted a Hazard Mitigation Plan that was
15		developed by the Nation's Office of Emergency Management ("OEM") and
16		approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") pursuant to
17		the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, Public Law 106-390 ("DMA2K"), on October 4,
18		2018 by Executive Order 2018-01; and
19	WHEREAS,	the Hazard Mitigation Plan adopted by the Nation on October 4, 2018 by Executive
20		Order 2018-01 was adopted by executive order rather than Tohono O'odham
21		Legislative Council due to a natural disaster event, Tropical Storm Rosa; and
22	WHEREAS,	the OEM has worked to develop the 2025 Tohono O'odham Nation Hazard
23		Mitigation Plan for the Nation pursuant to the DMA2K; and
24	WHEREAS,	the primary purpose of the 2025 Tohono O'odham Nation Hazard Mitigation Plan
25		is to identify the most likely hazards that could impact the Nation, assess the
26		vulnerability and risk posed by those hazards to the Nation as a whole, and to
27		develop strategies for hazard mitigation efforts and plan maintenance
28		procedures; and
29	WHEREAS,	the 2025 Tohono O'odham Nation Hazard Mitigation Plan recommends several
30		hazard mitigation actions and projects that will provide mitigation efforts for
31		specific hazards that could impact the Nation, in order to reduce loss of life and
32		property, by lessening the impact of disasters; and
