

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving Sanitation Facilities Deficiency System Priority Ranking)

RESOLUTION NO. 26-024

1 **WHEREAS**, the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with
2 the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,
3 education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"
4 (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)); and

5 **WHEREAS**, the Indian Health Service ("IHS"), Division of Environmental Health and
6 Engineering, conducts an annual assessment of Sanitation Facilities
7 Deficiencies; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the Division of Environmental Health and Engineering assessment does have an
9 impact upon Congressional appropriations and IHS allocation of funds; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the Indian Health Service has provided a Tribal Priority ranking of the four most
11 critical projects and allocated points, which impacts the overall prioritization of
12 projects in its 2025 Tucson Area IHS One-Line Listing (for FY26 Funding)
13 Sanitation Deficiency System ("Tucson Area Indian Health Service SDS priority
14 list"), which is incorporated by this reference; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the Division of Environmental Health and Engineering has provided the
16 recommendations to the Health and Human Services Committee regarding the
17 most critical needs; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the Health and Human Services Committee has reviewed and recommends
19 approval of the four most critical and desirable priorities.


20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council has reviewed
21 and approved all of the Tohono O'odham Nation projects on the Tucson Area
22 Indian Health Service SDS priority list and determined that the following
23 deficiencies are the four most critical and desirable, in descending order of
24 prioritization:

- 25 1. **Jackrabbit Water Tank**
- 26 2. **Chuichu Water Main Replacement**
- 27 3. **Pisinemo Lagoon Expansion**
- 28 4. **San Lucy Lagoon Erosion Improvements**

29 The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the **14th**
30 day of **JANUARY 2026** at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of **3,321.1 FOR; -0-**
31 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT**, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by
32 Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j) the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation,
33 adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy
34 Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the
35 **Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984)**.




