Whereas, Mr M.L.Girton, Superintendent of the Tucson Indian Training School at Tucson, Arizona has been actively interested in the education of a considerable number of Papago boys and girls; and

Whereas, it is the desire of the Papago Tribe to express its appreciation to M.Girton for his interest in the welfare of the Papago people, now, therefore.

Be is resolved by the Papago Council, that we hereby grant to Mr M.L.Girton of Tucson, Arizona. and party. as a token of friendship and appreciation. the right to hunt white wing. mourning dove, quail, and duck on the Papago Reservation. Subject to the provision of all Federal and State game laws and regulation.

The foregoing Resolution was on November 5. 1938, duly enacted by vote of 17 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council. Pursuant to authority vested in it by section 3(e) Article V. of the constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12. 1936. and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6. 1937. pursuant to section 16 of the act of June 18. 1934 (48 Stat. 984). said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior. pursuant to section 6. Article V. of the constitution and by-laws of the Papago Tribe.
