

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 52

Resolved by the Papago Council, that we hereby amend Resolution No. 42, approved September 3, 1938, to permit the use of the funds therein appropriated for defraying all expenses incidental to purchasing, assembling, packing, shipping, exhibiting, and selling articles of Papago art and craftsmanship at the Golden Gate International Exposition, San Francisco, California, including the pay and necessary expenses of person employed in connection therewith.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 7, 1939 duly enacted by a vote of 18 for, and 0 against, by the Papago council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3, (a) Article V. of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescision by the Secretary of Interior pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
