Whereas, it has been difficult for the United States Customs Service to maintain regular patrolmen at Sella, Arizona, on account of the shortage of suitable family housing; and

Shereas, the continued presence of Customs Patrolmen on the l'apago Kawervation will result in greater convenience to the Papago people by reducing the number of trips to the Sasabe and Ajo Ports of Entry which might otherwise be necessary in connection with travel to and fro across the International Boundary; and

The eas, the United States Castons Service is contemplating the construction of suitable living quarters for a patrolsan on the Sells "gancy Reserve as established by the Secretary of the Interior on July 4, 1935; and

Thereas. it is believed fitting and proper that exclusive control over any land reserved for the Customs Service chall vest in the United States Covernment.

Now, therefore, be it received by the Panago Council, that wo hereby consent, agree, and recommend, that the Secretary of the -Interior reserve for the Quetons Service a house site on the following described land in the village of Solls, Papago Reservation, Arizona, to-wit:

A plot of ground fronting 150 feet on the north side of the Tuceon-Ajo Road, located approximately 56 feet north of the Sells Agency Campus fence, the center of said plot being due north of Building No. 12 as shown on plot of Sells Agency as revised under date of July 6, 1939, extending 180 feet in depth from the Tucson-Ajo Road and containing approximately sixty-two one-hundredths of one acre.

The foregoing resolution was on October 7, 1939, duly enacted by a vote of 19 for, and 0 against, by the Pryago Council. purmant to authority vested in 1t by Lestion 1. (c), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Cocretary of the Interior on January 6: 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of Juna 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
