

RESOLUTION
OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 89

Resolved by the Papago Council that we hereby commission Abe Pable, Jose Narcho, and Joe Vasquez, as special Indian police to work under the direction of the Chief of Police of Sells Agency during the period of the Papago Fair and Rodeo immediately and after, commencing at the opening of business on November 9, 1939, and terminating at the close of business on November 13, 1939, each to be compensated at the rate of \$2.50 per day payable from the fund, "I. I. N. Acct. No. C-3, Court Funds, Papago Indians."

The foregoing resolution was on November 4, 1939, duly enacted by a vote of 16 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 5, Chapter 4, of the Law and Order Regulations approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 2, 1935, and by Sections 3(a) and 3(b-b), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1933, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
