

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 101

Resolved by the Papago Council that we hereby confirm the right of the United States of America to the use of a right-of-way, one-hundred (100) feet in width for all roads heretofore constructed on and across tribal lands of the Gila Bend, Papago, and San Xavier Reservations by the authority of the United States; and

Be it FURTHER RESOLVED, that in the future construction of roads on the Gila Bend, Papago, and San Xavier Reservations, the approval by the Papago Council, of Indian Service Form D, Individual Project Statement, or our approval of any other budget or Project Statement covering the approximate length and location of a road proposed for construction on and across tribal lands of the Gila Bend, Papago, and San Xavier Reservations, such approval shall automatically authorize the use of a right-of-way, one-hundred (100) feet in width, or as shown by the plans and specifications on file at Sells Indian Agency, Sells, Arizona, for the construction of said road.

The foregoing resolution was on May 11, 1940, duly enacted by a vote of 15 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 2, (c), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16, of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment.
