

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 113

Resolved, By the Papago Council, that in accordance with the provisions of Indian Office Unnumbered Circular Letters, dated July 25, 1938 and May 3, 1940, entitled "Use of Tribal Funds for Fire Suppression", we hereby authorize the expenditure of not to exceed \$1,000 from any funds on deposit in the Treasury of the United States to the credit of the Papago Tribe, for the suppression and emergency prevention of forest or range fires on or threatening the San Xavier, Papago, and Gila Band Reservation, Arizona, under the usual regulations for the suppression of such fires as promulgated by the Secretary of the Interior, for the Fiscal Year 1941.

The foregoing resolution was on June 1, 1940, duly enacted by a vote of 14 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3, (a, Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
