SHERRAS we have experienced great material and spiritual progress during the past few years organizing from a scattered tribe into one of the Toremost organized tribes; and

WHEREAS our lands have been improved through construction of water developments and farm improvement projects; and

WHEREAS our stock on our reservations have been improved through. selective breeding and through careful range management; and

WHEREAS progress in the above-mentioned and many other phases of tribal existence is due to the policies of the National Administration as earried out waser the kind, able, and untiring leadership of Superintendent T. B. Hall:

NOW THER FORE BE IT RESOLVED that, in behalf of the Papego Tribe, we take this occusion to express our deepest gratitude to Mr. Hall and his administratic.: for the many good things which we have enjoyed as a result of his efforts in our behalf; and

BE IT YURTHER RESOLVED that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated from the fund, "I. I. M. Acet. No. F-84, Contribut Fund. Papago Tribe," the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to be expended under the direction of the Chairman of the Papago Council for the purchase of a gift as a remembrance of the Papago Tribe to Superintendent Hall.

The foregoing Resolution was on November 2, 1940, duly enacted by a vote of 12 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), Article V. of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1935, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 15 of the Act of June 18, 1954 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its. rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6. Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
