

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 136

WHEREAS at the present time the Indian Oasis Hospital in the Papago Reservation is without an ambulance for conveying patients from the far ends of the reservation; and

WHEREAS it has been necessary to bring patients into the hospital in cars, and too often, in pickup trucks;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars from the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. P-84, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe", to be used in helping to buy an ambulance which will be used in the Papago Reservation; and

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this appropriation may not be used until the Indian Office shall have made arrangements for paying the balance of the cost of an ambulance and until arrangements shall have been made for a driver, fuel, and the maintenance of an ambulance, title to remain with the government.

The foregoing Resolution was on December 7, 1940, duly enacted by a vote of 18 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3, (a), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
