

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 166

The State of Arizona has imposed a Dourine quarantine on the Papago Reservation, which restricts the sale and removal of horses from the Reservation. This creates a problem which is of grave concern, both to the Government and to the Papago people. A large number of unproductive horses need to be removed each year from the Papago reservation to provide additional income to the people and to allow room on the range for the good horses and the productive livestock, such as cattle.

The solution of this problem will require the best efforts of the Papago people and the Government. Our Government is at this time fighting for its existence and needs the help of all of its people, in every way possible. It is felt that the Papago people are more than willing to do their share.

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council, as representatives of the Papago Tribe, will cooperate and assume responsibility for the participation of the Tribe to the following extent:

1. That each District will round up their own horses for test at such time and places as decided upon by the Chairman of the Council and the District delegates concerned.
2. That the work of rounding up and holding horses will be donated by the men of the various districts as their part in the program.

The Government agrees to furnish the doctors needed for the tests, to pay expenses of shipping samples, and to pay for any reactors found, at the following rates:

Hules	\$ 25.00	Unbroke stock	\$ 9.00
Broke saddle & Work Horses	\$ 12.50	Colts up to yearlings	\$ 3.00

The foregoing Resolution was on March 28, 1942 duly enacted by a vote of 9 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (k), Article V. of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
