RESOLUTION OF THE PAPACE CONCIL

WHEREAS on August 1, 1942 a meeting of the Papago Council was held in Salls, Arizona., and at which twelve mambers of the Council were present including the Chairman who may vote only in case of a tie,

MERCAS the previous meetings could not be held because a quorus was lacking and it was felt that certain pusiness had to be completed and there seemed to be the possibility that a george could not be gotten together because of transportation difficulties over the entire rapago deservation, and;

KHERELAS after that time a meeting was held at which a quorum was present, therefore

BU IT ESSOLVED by the Papago Council that Resolutions 174 and 175, both of which were enacted at that meeting under what were considered very pressing circumstances, be confirmed by a ununimous Your of the Papago Council in the mosting of Nevember 7, 1942 at which a quorum of the membership was present.

The foregoing Resolution was on Reveaber 7, 1942 only enacted by a vote of 12 for and O against by the rapage Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (a), Article 7 and Section 3 (b), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on becember 12, 1936, and approved by the pecretary of the Interior on denuary 6, 1997, pursuant to section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1734 (48 Stat. 984). Seid hesolution is effective as of the date of its approval of the Superintendent of Sella Amency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution of the rapage Tribe.
