

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

WHEREAS on August 1, 1942 a meeting of the Papago Council was held in Sells, Arizona., and at which twelve members of the Council were present including the Chairman who may vote only in case of a tie, and;

WHEREAS the previous meetings could not be held because a quorum was lacking and it was felt that certain business had to be completed and there seemed to be the possibility that a quorum could not be gotten together because of transportation difficulties over the entire Papago reservation, and;

WHEREAS after that time a meeting was held at which a quorum was present, therefore


BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Resolutions 174 and 175, both of which were enacted at that meeting under what were considered very pressing circumstances, be confirmed by a unanimous vote of the Papago Council in the meeting of November 7, 1942 at which a quorum of the membership was present.


The foregoing Resolution was on November 7, 1942 duly enacted by a vote of 12 for and 0 against by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 5 (a), Article V and Section 3 (k), Article V of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 15, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe.


